Rules and Regulations

- Exhibitors from ADJOINING COUNTIES may compete for premiums.
- Every article in competition must correspond in number and description with the premium list and be in proper class to obtain a premium.
- No article or animal on exhibition will be permitted to be taken before the close of the fair, under penalty of forfeiture of premium, except by permission of the superintendent of the division in which it is exhibited.
- No animal or article unworthy of premium shall receive one, even though there is no competition.
- All animals or articles entered and exhibited shall conform with the rules of the respective departments.
- In all cases not covered by rules, the superintendent and judges of the department, together with the secretary of the fair, shall constitute the adjudicating committee.
- The executive committee will take every precaution for the preservation and care of every animal and article on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage either during their delivery or while on the fairgrounds or during removal.
- No article or animal shall compete for more than one premium.
- Limited space prohibits displaying non-judged items.
- Youth 16 and under are eligible to enter exhibits in all classes. Not just youth.
- All articles must be made by exhibitors - pictures must be taken by exhibitor.
- No person may exhibit more than one article in the same lot.
- Any article receiving a premium at this fair in previous years will be automatically rejected in judging.

JUDGES

- Judges shall read and conform with all general rules and special rules in the respective classes.
- No appeal from the decision of the judges is allowed; the judges' decision is final.
- The judges shall rule out any article or animal not answering the entry requirements.
- When there is nothing in a class deserving a premium, judges shall make no award; lack of competition shall not be cause for withholding a premium if the animal or article is worthy.
