Kappa Delta Sorority Builds Women of Action

In support of Gretchen Swasey, Secretary of CAPA, and member of Kappa Delta Sorority, this month's newsletter feature represents the sorority's friendship, fame and philanthropy. Gretchen has also served as Scholarship Chair, Ways and Means Chair and Treasurer for CAPA. She graduated in 1994 from Indiana University.

Kappa Delta was founded on October 23, 1897 at the State Female Normal School (now Longwood University) in Farmville, Virginia. Its founders are Lenora Ashmore Blackiston, Sara Turner White, Mary Sommerville Sparks Hendrick, and Julia Gardiner Tyler Wilson, the granddaughter of U.S. President John Tyler.

In 1902, Kappa Delta's second chapter was established at the Chatham Episcopal Institute in Virginia. It was a short-lived chapter and was forced off campus in 1904 by the school's administration. Among the women initiated into the chapter during those two years was Georgia O'Keeffe. She enrolled at Chatham in 1903 and graduated in 1905. It was the Institute's principal and art instructor, Elizabeth May Wilson, who encouraged O'Keeffe's interest in art. O'Keeffe, a prolific artist, lived nearly a century and she was awarded a Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor.

O'Keeffe's legacy is preserved at the Georgia O'Keeffe Museum in Santa Fe, New Mexico. In 1998, the O'Keeffe Art and Leadership Program for Girls was established there, and it provides opportunities for young women ages 11-13. Each summer, the Kappa Delta Foundation funds two paid

internship opportunities working with the leadership program.

Fast Facts:

- Kappa Delta Sorority has more than 250,000 members, 166 active collegiate chapters, and 200 alumnae chapters worldwide. With headquarters in Memphis, TN, its stated vision is: Kappa Delta Sorority is committed to providing opportunities and experiences that build confidence and inspire women to action.
- KD's national philanthropies are Girl Scouts of the USA and Prevent Child Abuse America; its colors are olive green and pearl white; jewels are diamond, emerald and pearl; and symbols are white rose, nautilus shell, dagger; and mascots, the teddy bear and katydid.

NPC Trivia: 12 Lost Sororities

International Badge Day is a fitting time to look at one of the most mysterious topics in sorority history-groups that have disappeared. At its largest membership in 1957, NPC had 32 members. It is good to know that in over a half century our numbers have remained relatively strong as there are now 26 NPC sororities. Curiosity led me to seek out the missing 6 NPC sororities, but I was surprised to find that there were more than 6 missing organizations. With internet research I was able to document 10 groups that were once part of the Panhellenic Circle of friendship but no longer exist. My original research was included in our May 2010 newsletter.

I recently found a website called Fraternity History and More which confirmed that in addition to the 10 groups previously documented there were another 2 associate NPC members that we need to remember.

All but one of these groups merged with another NPC sorority so they are still a part of us. Have you heard of any of these groups before?

Alpha Delta Theta joined NPC in 1926. Merged with Phi Mu in 1939. Hazel Falconer Benninghoven served as national president for both organizations.

Beta Phi Alpha joined NPC in 1923 and merged with Delta Zeta in 1941. BΦA's "Convention Lights" is still sung at the close of Delta Zeta conventions.

Beta Sigma Omicron joined NPC in 1933 and merged with Zeta Tau Alpha in 1964. Three chapters on campuses with Zetas became Alpha Phi. Their motto was "We live

to do Good" and their colors were ruby and pink.

Delta Sigma Epsilon was an AES (Association of Education Sororities) that joined NPC as an associate in 1947 and a full member in 1951. They merged with Delta Zeta in 1956. They were founded at Miami University of Ohio in 1914

Iota Alpha Pi was a Jewish sorority that joined NPC as an associate in 1953 and a full member in 1957. In 1971 they chose to disband rather than merge with another group, the only occasion where this has occurred. Alumnae continued to meet despite lack of a national organization and they have a Facebook page.

Lambda Omega became an associate member of NPC in 1930 and in 1933 merged with Theta Upsilon which merged with Delta Zeta in 1962.

Phi Omega Pi became an NPC member in 1933. They disbanded in 1946 with chapters being taken over by a variety of sororities. Delta Zeta absorbed the alumnae and remaining collegiate chapters.

Pi Kappa Sigma was an AES sorority that joined NPC in 1947 and merged with Sigma Kappa in 1959. It was the first education sorority established as a greek letter organization in 1897.

Theta Upsilon joined NPC in 1928 and merged with Delta Zeta in 1962. Their original ritual was based on Native American themes and their motto was "let there be light".

Theta Sigma Upsilon was an AES that joined NPC as an associate in 1947 and a full member in 1951. They merged with Alpha Gamma Delta in 1959. Their motto was "The Higher good" and their colors were silver and rose.

Pi Sigma Gamma was sponsored by NPC in 1930 but ended up affiliating with Beta Sigma Omicron.

Sigma Phi Beta became an associate member in 1928. In 1933 they merged with Phi Omega Pi.
