The Position – Housing Advocacy Coordinator

We are seeking a Housing Advocacy Coordinator for LCADV which is located in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The Housing Advocacy Coordinator is responsible for statewide advocacy to improve systemic responses to the housing needs of domestic violence survivors. The Housing Advocacy Coordinator will provide technical assistance to Louisiana's domestic violence programs regarding the development and enhancement of housing programming. This position will engage with stakeholders as a strategist in the development of trauma informed policies in various areas, with an emphasis on housing stability and economic justice, in order to promote and develop best practices statewide.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities

Develop and maintain resources specific to systemic responses to domestic violence, including but not limited to housing and economic justice.

Provide ongoing technical assistance to domestic violence programs on the development and implementation of trauma informed housing programming.

Provide training and technical assistance to other stakeholders on housing policy and practices pertaining to domestic violence survivors.

Facilitate collaboration among various stakeholders.

Represent LCADV on various boards and task forces, as needed.

Implement additional projects of service to member programs, as needed.

Complete programmatic and grant reports, as required.

Qualifications

Understanding of the role of state domestic violence coalitions and domestic violence programs in the intervention and prevention of domestic violence.

Minimum 3 years' experience working in a domestic violence program or housing program.

Knowledge on the intersections of domestic violence and access to permanent housing, and knowledge of various housing approaches, programs, and policies.

Experience with HMIS or a comparable database is strongly preferred.

Effective meeting facilitation skills.

Ability to maintain confidentiality in all matters.

Ability to function effectively in stressful and/or crisis situations.

Commitment to work hours as needed to complete assigned responsibilities.

Demonstrated ability to manage time, evaluate progress, and to adjust tasks/activities to complete work within established time frames.

Ability to work cooperatively as part of a team.

Ability to work independently with self-discipline and self-motivation.

Ability to work with people of diverse backgrounds.

Computer knowledge and skills, including Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, and Excel.
