

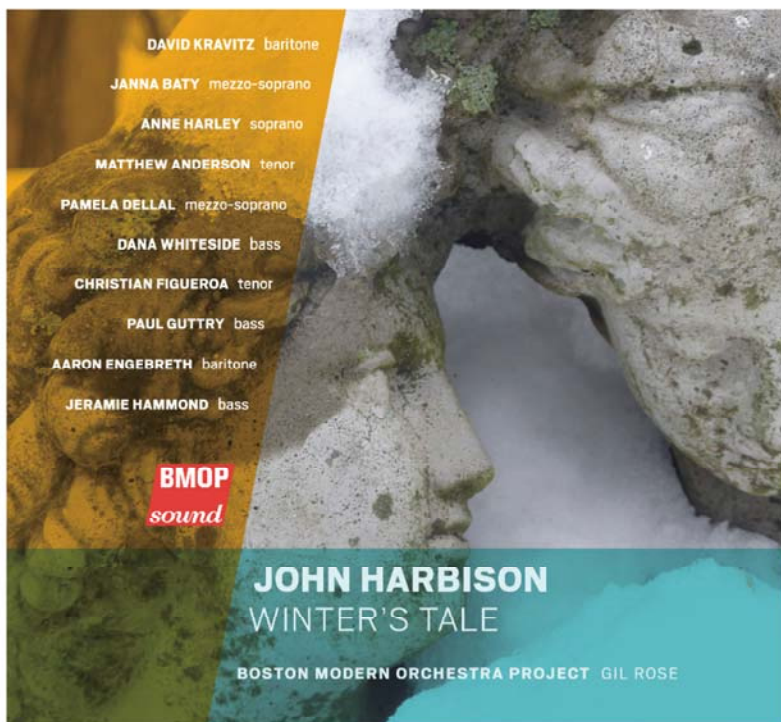
**JOHN HARBISON** WINTER'S TALE [1023]

BMOP/sound is proud to release its third CD of John Harbison's music, his first opera *Winter's Tale*. A Shakespearian drama, *Winter's Tale* follows a plot of jealousy, deceit, and murder between Sicilian and Bohemian royalty. Personalizing the piece, Harbison shortened the original five acts to two and introduced Dumbshows to streamline the narrative. Featured in this gripping recording are the vocal talents of David Kravitz (baritone), Janna Baty (mezzo-soprano), Anne Harley (soprano), Matthew Anderson (tenor), Pamela Dellal (mezzo-soprano), Dana Whiteside (bass), Christian Figueroa (tenor), Paul Guttry (bass), Aaron Engebretth (baritone), and Jeramie Hammond (bass).
