- 8th Grade History:
 - One composition books – non-spiral-bound
 - 3-ring 2" binder or folder (however you want to organize handouts/work)
 - Post-its® (3" x 3") plus 1/2" flag Post-its®
- One or two 1 1/2" to 2" 3-ring binders with dividers to be dedicated among the rest of your classes (Language Acquisition, Math, PE, World Cultures, Music, Introduction to Technology, or electives) as requested by teachers during your first week. These can be organized according to the day's schedule: one for Period 1, 2, 3, 7 days and one for Period 4, 5, 6, 7 days. Two notebooks may not be needed if you have Humanities and Science on the same day and a folder may suffice. NOTE: Avoid 3-ring binders wider than 2 inches.

UPPER SCHOOL

- Binder(s) for organizing classwork for the rest of your classes:
 - It is recommended to organize one notebook for Period 1, 2, 3, 7 days and one notebook for Period 4, 5, 6, 7 days with pocket subject dividers for each of your classes that meet on those days (check your schedule).
 - A plastic two-pocket folder dedicated for homework is also recommended.

INDIVIDUAL EMERGENCY KITS *

In the event of an earthquake or other disaster during school hours, all students will be cared for on campus by West Sound Academy staff. In order to help everyone be prepared in the event of any such emergency, each student needs to have an individual kit with the following items. These kits will be stored on campus, and will be sent home at the end of the school year if they are not used. Use a plastic container with a separate lid, and have the student’s name clearly written on the outside. **Due to storage constraints at school, please use a container that is no larger than 12-quart capacity.**

Each individual emergency kit should contain:

- 2 large (33-gallon size) garbage bags
- 3 plastic spoons
- 2 granola bars
- 2 candy bars
- 3 containers of juice (aseptic cartons or cans)
- 1 Mylar blanket
- 3 cans of food (pull-top lid only – nothing requiring a can-opener)
- 2-3 small containers of pudding
- 3 boxes, individual-serving size, of ready-to-eat cereal
- 1 flashlight with batteries
- Comforting letter from parents with photo

*For safety reasons, please turn in emergency kits to the front office **no later than two weeks after the first day of school.**
