



Job Title: Registered Behavior Technician for ABA Services

Overview: Responsible for conducting assessments, gathering data and implementing intervention plans.

Reports to: BCBA Supervisor

FLSA: Non -Exempt

Duties:

1. Help administer assessments
 - a. Functional behavior assessments/ functional analyses
 - b. Verbal Behavior- Milestones Assessment and Placement Program (VB-MAPP)
 - c. Assessment of Basic Language and Learning Skills-Revised (ABLLS-R)
 - d. Preference assessments
 - e. SRA Direct Instruction placement and progress tests
2. Focus instruction on goals and benchmarks outlined in the Individualized Treatment Plan
3. Discrete Trial Teaching
 - a. Implement structured, individualized, skill acquisition programs
 - b. Collect and graph data daily
 - c. Replace targets and programs when mastered
 - d. Prepare all teaching materials, note cards, data sheets, and reinforcers
 - e. Graph comprehensive data weekly
 - f. Follow individualized reinforcement schedules
4. Direct Instruction
 - a. Follow direct instruction curriculum as outlined in the teaching book and guide
 - b. Follow individualized reinforcement schedules
 - c. Ensure that all children in the group are responding
5. Administer one-on-one behavior intervention programs
 - a. Follow behavior change procedures outlined in the BIP
 - b. Collect and record data, when necessary.
 - c. Graph behavior intervention data daily
6. Natural Environment Teaching (NET)
 - a. Implement individualized natural environment teaching procedures
 - b. Collect and graph data daily
7. Research articles relevant to ABA strategies, programs, and interventions
8. Gather materials for assessment and teaching
 - a. For assessment- VB-MAPP and ABLLS
 - b. For DTT- note cards and manipulatives.
9. Other job duties as assigned.



Knowledge Skills and Abilities Required:

- Skill in organizing resources and establishing priorities.
- Ability to foster a cooperative work environment.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills (oral and written) and the ability to work effectively with a wide range of constituencies in a diverse community.
- Exceptional interpersonal and communication skills to a level needed to influence change and mold work behaviors of all stakeholders.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Coursework and/or training specific to the field of ABA
- Previous experience working with children with Autism.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree or higher in Special Education, Psychology or a related field preferred.
