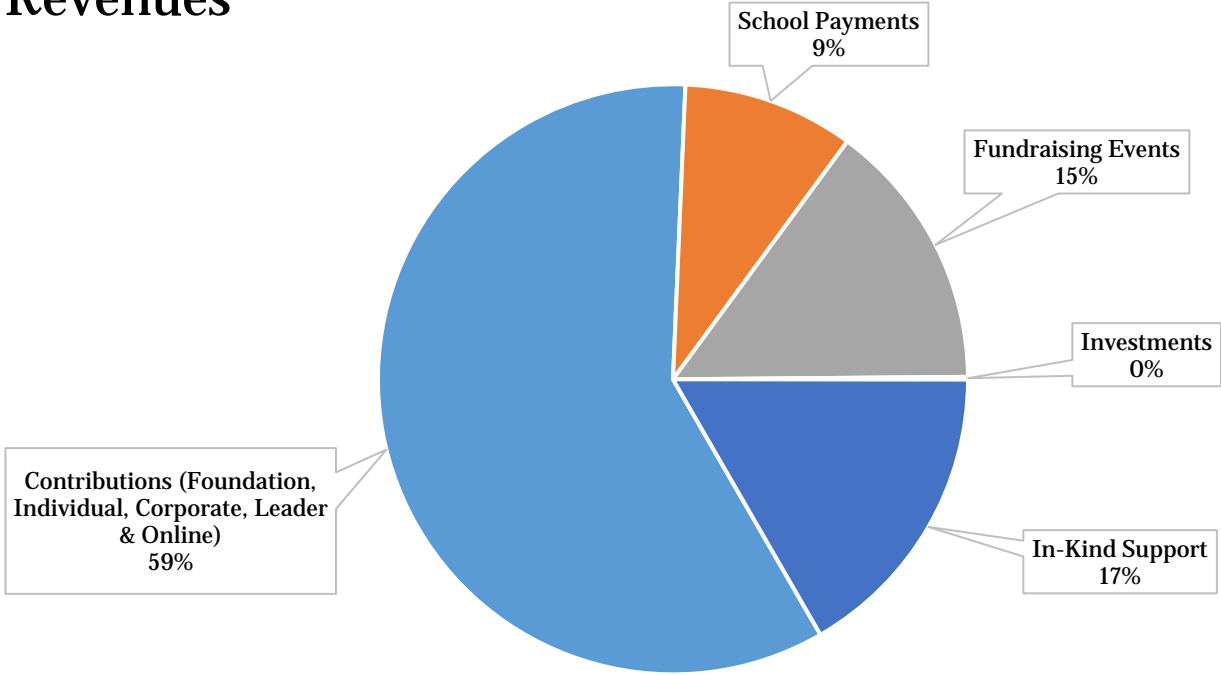

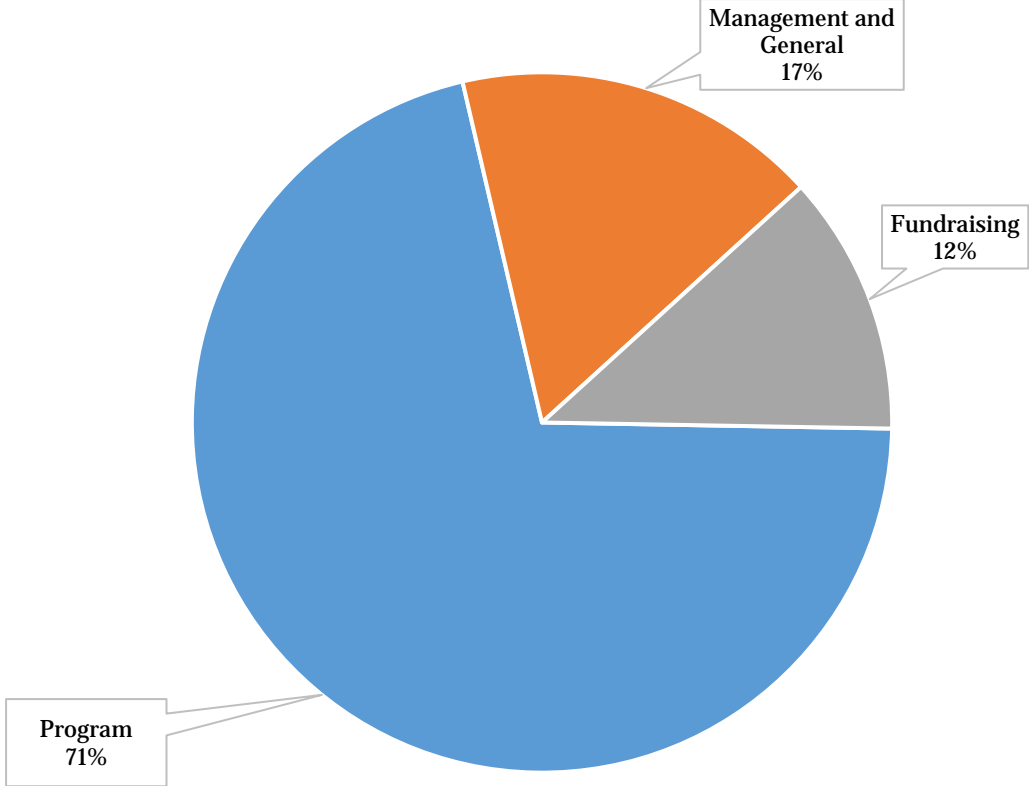

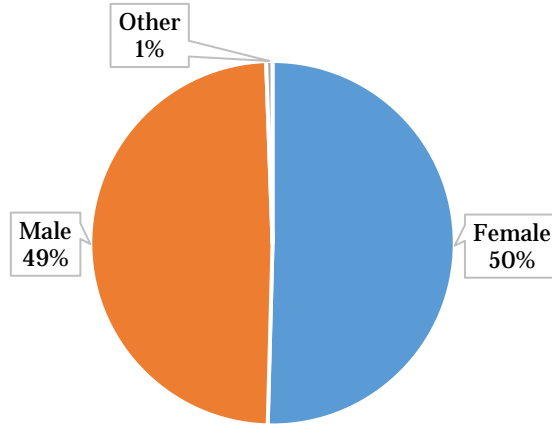

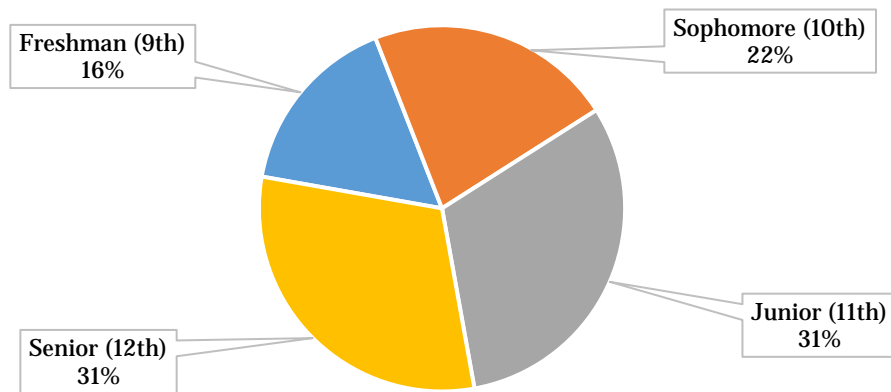
Expenses
