Divine Mercy Sunday

Divine Mercy Sunday, the 2nd Sunday of Easter, celebrates the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Paschal Mystery—the mystery of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ—made present to us in the Eucharist. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of St. Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. The message of The Divine Mercy is simple: God loves all of us, and wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others.
