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Multiple Diagnosis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dictating multiple diagnoses with NO NOTE: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A comma is used to separate multiple diagnoses. Ex. Hypertension, Hyperlipidemia. If you are using speech you would say Hypertension coma hyperlipidemia. • Dictating multiple diagnosis with A NOTE: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Dictate the diagnosis and the note (follow the Document a Free Text Note steps below) the say New Line. You will then dictate your next diagnosis and note. Continue this process for all diagnoses you are documenting.
Order	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Order • Orders • Ordering
An Order	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dictate what you are ordering followed by the word FOR and then the diagnosis listed under the Diagnosis section. Ex- Lipid Panel for Hyperlipidemia
Multiple orders	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dictate the syntax above for dictating An Order followed by dictating New Line. Repeat the syntax for dictating An Order
Order Sets	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Order Sets • Order Set
Prescribe a Medication under Assessment and Plan	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prescribe • Prescribing • Prescribed
Ordering a medication under prescribe	<p>Dictate the name, strength, dosage, number or quantity, days, and refills followed by the word FOR and then the diagnosis listed under the diagnosis header. Ex: Say/Type Lisinopril 10mg 1 tablet daily number 30 days 30 refills 6 FOR Hypertension</p>
Document a Free Text Note	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Note: -Make sure to say Colon if using speech- followed by your narrative • “ or Open Quote if using speech- followed by your narrative “ or End Quote
To move to the next section within a Samantha Speech Template	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Next • Next Section • Dictate the name of the section you want to move to
To move to a previous section within a Samantha Speech Template	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Previous • Previous Section • Dictate the name of the section you want to move to
