90 Points - A proprietary blend of 54% Cabernet Sauvignon, 24% Merlot and the rest Petit Verdot, Malbec and Cabernet Franc, the 2013 The Mariner offers good blackcurrant fruit, new saddle leather and toasty vanillin from the oak (about 40% is new). This attractive, medium-bodied, refreshing, Bordeaux-style wine should drink nicely for at least a decade.

90 Points - This wine consists of all five red Bordeaux varieties, with 54% Cabernet Sauvignon making up the majority. A juicy front palate of cassis and blueberry leads to leathery, dusty tannins and notes of graphite, cedar and tea.

WINE & SPIRITS

90 Points - It's an inky, big-boned wine, with dense tannins, ripe flavors of blackberry and chocolate, and some appetizing herbal nuances at the edges. Hunter Hammer of San Francisco's Jardinière suggested that its bold, hearty richness would be particularly appetizing with a medium-rare ribeye.

95 Points - One of Dry Creek's Meritage bottlings, and it always seems to be my favorite of the lot. Like this vintage, they're always built in a way that enables early enjoyment, but if you're the patient sort, they will also age gracefully over the long term. Gorgeous black berry, black cherry, mild leaf and chocolate notes, and just a touch of dried herbs are all present in aroma and flavor, and are already nicely integrated. The tannin structure shows a touch of firmness at present, but a short decant will round it off just fine.
