| <p>Green County Referendum</p> <p>On January 10, 2010, in <i>Citizens United v. Federal Elections Commission</i>, the United States Supreme Court held that political spending is a form of protected speech under the First Amendment and the government may not keep corporations or unions from spending money to support or denounce individual candidates in elections. While corporations or unions may not give money directly to campaigns, they may seek to persuade the voting public through other means, including advertisements. Shall Green County support passage of an amendment to the United States Constitution stating the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Only human beings — not corporations, unions, nonprofits or other legal entities — are endowed with constitutional rights, and 2. Money is not speech, and therefore regulating political contributions and spending is not equivalent to limiting political speech. <p><input type="radio"/> Yes</p> <p><input type="radio"/> No</p> | <p>Village of Monticello</p> <p>Under state law, the increase in the levy of the Village of Monticello was limited to 0.72% in levy year 2017, which resulted in a levy of \$325,498, before any debt adjustments. Shall the Village of Monticello be allowed to exceed this limit and increase the levy for the next five fiscal years by \$218,000, beginning fiscal year 2018 the purpose for which the increased levy will be used is public works and public safety capital equipment/vehicles, operational costs for public works street maintenance, employee retention, safety training, computers/software, pool maintenance and equipment, and cemetery maintenance and expansion expenses over the next five years, by a an approximate total of 66.5%, prior to any debt service adjustments, for an estimated total Village tax levy of \$545,841?
