- Essay length:
 - o 350-400 words for 5th & 6th graders
 - o 600-750 words for 7th & 8th graders
- Essays must be typed or hand written (in ink) on one side of the paper
- Punctuation and grammar count! Make sure your essay is double checked for errors!
- You MUST have a TITLE page as your first page with ALL of the following information:
 - student name and home mailing address
 - o email address (winners will be contacted by email)
 - o name of school, name of teacher, teacher email, and grade level

Essay may address ANY OR ALL of the following:

- O What is a pollinator?
- O Why are pollinators important?
- o How do pollinators affect my life?
- O What types of animals are pollinators?
- o Discuss different types of pollination.
- O What types of plants depend on pollinators?
- O What can we do to help pollinators to thrive?

BE CREATIVE! The winners each year have shown a level of creativity and content over and above the average. Tell a personal story or anecdote to make your essay stand out in a crowd!
