Lyle Superintendent Andrew Kelly Accepts Position with North Beach School District

Lyle Community Schools Superintendent and Principal Andrew Kelly announced today that he has accepted the position of Superintendent with North Beach Schools in Ocean Shores, Washington. He will serve the remainder of the current year's contract, which ends June 30, 2018.



During that time, the district has experienced steady growth in test scores and its financial situation has improved substantially. Based on the district's academic growth, Kelly was recently selected as the Washington State Southwest Region Student Achievement Leader by the Washington Association of School Administrators (WASA).

"The growth that Lyle School District has made in the past three years is truly remarkable and a tribute to the commitment and belief by each educator within the district that all kids can succeed," Superintendent Kelly said. "Lyle has amazing kids and families and it is truly my hope that the trajectory

towards success will continue following this transition."

"Andy has an amazing ability to bring change and I am sure that North Beach will benefit from his leadership and skills," Board President Phil Williams said.

"The board's top priority is to now find the right person to fill this important leadership role and to continue the district's growth," Williams added.

"I'm so thankful for the support that the community and staff have provided me and my children for the past three years," Superintendent Kelly concluded. "#ALLmeansALL must continue to permeate everything that happens for kids in Lyle. Our kids are absolutely worth it!"

Superintendent Kelly was hired by the Lyle Community Schools Board of Directors in June, 2015, and has led the district for the past three years.

Community Council Corner

Council Report for June 14, 2018

Council Member Dave McNeil is now a part of the Klickitat County Board of Equalization. This group adjusts for fair tax levies on properties throughout the county.

Andrew Kelly has resigned as Superintendent of Lyle Schools, effective 30 June.

Dave McNeil attended the recent the recent Water District meeting, as our long-time representative (Pauline Coffield) has passed away. He reports that the lines on 3rd Avenue are aging out. We can expect replacement within the next couple of years, hopefully with a minimum of disruption. Meanwhile, residential meters are being checked, as somewhere around one million gallons of water usage during the last year is unaccounted for. Whether this is leakage, faulty meters, or illegal tap-ins is yet to be proven.

A Re-zone to Airport/Industrial has been approved for the SageTech operation in the former Dallesport School. A second floor is being retrofitted into the gymnasium. Some employees will be moving in this summer, with full operations projected for November. A public Grand Opening Tour will be scheduled when remodeling is completed.

The open land just south of the Post Office should see development begin in August or September. The Community Council has given approval for the 26-unit project, and the County Planning Department is fast-tracking the permitting process.

The annual "Got Trash Day" has been postponed until 14 July. Pick up a voucher (one per address) at the Post Office, good for a yard of free disposal that day. Have your proof of residency with you when you take your load over! And maybe take a load for a neighbor who does not have a pickup (take the neighbor, too, with their ID).

Neighborhood Watch has two areas organized, with more forthcoming. Look for Dave McNeil to come around with information and enrollment packets. Besides helping to reduce criminal activity in our community, we want to keep an eye out for the needs of our neighbors.

The next Community Council meeting is scheduled for **12 July, 7 PM** at the Community Center. Our speaker, Sharon Carter, will have information on Senior Services, plus on Public Transit fixed-route operations that are projected to be up-and-running in a few months.

Lyle Class of 2018 Picks Up Potential \$209,000 in Scholarships

On June 2, Lyle High School graduated 23 students, this year's entire senior class. These graduates have a range of plans for their post-secondary years, many of them considering a two- or four-year degree. With 18 students qualified for College Bound Scholarships, the group has potentially \$209,000 in funding available to help them make their dreams come true.

Students in Washington state sign up for the College Bound scholarship in their 7th and 8th grade years, and promise to maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher and stay out of trouble. The scholarship provides students up to \$10,800 each year toward college tuition costs, after other grants and scholarships are applied toward the full cost. While we do not know how many will take advantage of the scholarship, if all 18 students did so, they could potentially receive up to \$194,000 in a single year. The scholarship is renewable for four years.

In addition to the College Bound Scholarships, eight Lyle students – one-third of the class – collected another \$15,000 in competitive scholarships. "Our Lyle students continue to prove that they can compete with the best of the best," Superintendent Kelly shared. "We are so proud of the grit, perseverance and courage of each of our graduates and are confident that they will make a tremendous mark in the world around them."

This marked the first year that Sagetech Corporation has offered scholarships for Lyle's students. Sagetech

Chief Financial Officer Keith Kennedy personally presented the awards at the graduation ceremony, noting that the applications had touched the hearts of those in his office who read them, prompting more than a few tears.

Class Valedictorian Morgan Bowman, who plans to attend Central Washington University this fall, received \$2,500 from Sagetech, in addition to four other scholarships totaling \$3,250. This includes being the top candidate of 20 applicants from multiple high schools for the very competitive PEO Sisterhood scholarship of \$1,000. Morgan also received a \$1,000 scholarship from the Lyle Alumni Association, \$750 from the Lyle Lions Club and \$500 from the Beverly Ann Bryan fund.

Zach Miller, who is Western Washington University-bound, also netted a \$2,500 award from Sagetech, one of four scholarships he received totaling \$4,500. Those include a \$750 Lyle Lions Club award, \$1,000 from the Pam Oldenburg Memorial Fund and \$250 from the Beverly Ann Bryan fund.

Sagetech provided two additional scholarships in the amount of \$500 each to Phoenix Dorsey and Shakira Kelly. Shakira also received \$750 from the Lyle Lions Club and \$250 from the Beverly Ann Bryan fund. Phoenix and Shakira are both attending Evergreen University in the fall, where Shakira will play women's basketball for the Geoducks.

Tristin Palmer, who plans to attend Western Washington University,

also received a Lyle Alumni Association scholarship of \$1,000, with a bonus \$250 from the Beverly Ann Bryan fund.

Two students, Katelynn Oldfield and Isabella Rubio, were recipients of the new Lyle Schools/Robert Halverson Scholarship award for \$250 each. Established in January of this year, the fund gained enough interest in six months to provide these scholarships. As the fund continues to grow, future scholarships are expected to be more substantial.

Katelynn plans to pursue a career in education and has already passed the "para-educator" assessment to allow her to work as a classroom assistant. In addition to working, Katelynn will begin chipping away at credits in education in the fall. Through a remote Running Start program, offered on the Lyle campus for the first time this year, she has already completed coursework toward her degree.

Finally, Vanessa Ordaz received \$1,000 from an anonymous donor to support her education at Perry Tech. Mr. Kelly presented the check, explaining to Vanessa and the audience that he was approached in Lyle recently by an individual who had the opportunity at one time to speak with Vanessa about her challenges and her plans.

That person wrote a \$1,000 check, and asked Mr. Kelly to present the "Guardian Angel Scholarship" to Vanessa, and to let our students know that people in the community "do pay attention to how you're doing."

Triage Vol II, Issue VI

I recently realized as I took my EMT written test to become a Washington State EMT, (still one in Oregon) that it has been 30 years since I first became an EMT and the changes that have taken place in our industry.

Just this week one of the founding magazines devoted exclusively to pre-hospital care, JEMS, the Journal of Emergency Medicine decided to stop printing its magazine any longer and convert to an all-electronic format. I learned EMS from this magazine as did many others. I read what other professionals across the country were doing and learned tricks of the trade and research from around the world. The days of seeing the magazine's cover on the kitchen table, creating the nucleus for discussion maybe gone, but the education hasn't stopped. Today's crews still get this information but from their phones.

Also this week I attended the Washington State Ambulance Association

meeting and in discussion it was mentioned that Washington's DHS reimbursement program for ambulance rates haven't been raised since 2004, that's 14 years ago. Needless to say everything cost more than it did 14 years ago and our industry is no different. Wages, health care, ambulances, fuel, medical devices, have at the very least increased 3% a year and in most cases more like 8-10%.

There was a time when one of our ambulances used to cost \$95,000 and now it's closer to \$160,000.

We just had an internal review of our expenses completed by some very smart folks and it was determined that on average it cost us \$1,275.00 to run one EMS call. Our average reimbursement is \$825.00. DHS reimbursement is less than \$300.00. I suppose this is one thing that hasn't changed the significant difference in cost vs. revenue. EMS is almost an unsustainable industry without either

volume of transports or other sources (taxes) of revenue outside of fees for transports.

Another change is we have a website www.kcems1.com. While we are still updating and adding content, we'd be glad if you visited it.

One thing that hasn't changed is those involved in providing the service. They are still passionate about their profession, helping those that can't help themselves and the desire to be there when they are needed. I suppose we all can find comfort in that.
