Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A guideline to the roles and responsibilities of a club coach at Fremont YSC. Report to Director of Football on all matters related to the sporting operations –

- **Coaching**
 - Deliver sessions to your assigned group/teams.
 - Coverage will be needed at times for other coaches, and coverage can also be requested for your own sessions. This must be cleared through DoF.
 - Follow the age appropriate curriculum provided by DoF.
 - Coach match days of your assigned teams, following the Fremont YSC systems and structures of play.
 - Coverage will be needed at times for other coaches, and coverage can also be requested. This must be cleared through DoF.
 - Complete subscribed educational tasks, and supplemental coaching tasks.
 - Completion of session reflections, 1 due with each submission of timesheets.
 - Some educational material is required by State Law ('HeadsUp'), other educational events/courses will be required as per club requirements.
 - Arrange with support of managers, end of season events for teams.

- **Communication**
 - Players
 - Communicate with players during practices regarding their player profiles, supporting their developmental needs.
 - Update players of club events
 - Reinforce the behaviors and expectations of Fremont YSC players as outlined by the Club culture.
 - Parents
 - Communicate through TeamSnap the practice schedule and game schedule.
 - Add club events to the TeamSnap app.
 - Communicate before games the topics to be worked on during the game.
 - Reinforce club communication with parents through passing on club wide sent messages through your own personal team accounts through TeamSnap.
 - Engage with parents around practices and games, as a club representative.
 - Managers
 - Recruit team manager
 - Assign and communicate an understanding between manager and coach as to what tasks are expected of the manager, and expectations of behavior and boundaries.
 - Build rapport with team managers, in professional manner.

- **Professionalism**
 - Wearing the appropriate club uniform at club events.
 - Practices – the provided uniform and cleats/turf shoes.
 - Games – the provided game day polo top and provided uniform.
 - Meetings – polo top and provided uniform.



- Under no circumstance should any coach be seen with alcohol or recreation drugs while displaying the Fremont YSC logo.
 - Pursuit of continued education.
 - Association educational pathway, certifications, educational events, and research around supplemental areas of expertise.

OBJECTIVES

- **Communication -**
 - Maintain and commit to continued and appropriate communication with all parents of players.
 - Frequent and appropriate communication with Directors when addressing any issues or in need of any support.
- **Coaching –**
 - Be kind to kids, but importantly challenge and push players out of a comfort zone to reach their potential.
 - Provide a high performance culture and environment to develop the individual player, to allow them to reach their potential.
 - All sessions delivered in reference to the Fremont YSC game model.

This list is not exhaustive and will be updated and modified as and when appropriate.

EXPECTATIONS

- To work within the spirit of the club, follow the mission and vision of the club, and continuously support the club’s direction.
- Complete all expected coaching tasks and administration paperwork as per the operational needs of the club.
- Continued education, and self-development in optimizing knowledge and modern coaching methodologies.
- To operate with integrity and openness, and participate in decision making and debate, to harness and optimize a high-performance environment for player development.
