So instead of ripping out the room's turn-of-the-century fixtures, the designer adapted them for today. The footed porcelain tub was left in place, and some old nickel silver legs were salvaged and topped with a new serpentine vanity. The new floor tile has an old-fashioned feeling and so does the monochromatic color scheme. The brilliant hall-of-mirrors effect, carefully planned by the designer, occupies no space but adds great spatial excitement. Jacobs, most of whose work is strictly contemporary, added a few up-to-the-minute touches, such as the black Philippe Starck chairs.
