Phil Beck joined Hamilton County Administration in 2013 as The Banks Project Executive, a joint Hamilton County and City of Cincinnati position. A \$2.7 billion public/private transit-oriented urban redevelopment project, The Banks is the largest economic development project in Hamilton County and Greater Cincinnati.

Prior to his current public sector position, Mr. Beck worked for 25 years in the private sector extensively as a program manager and construction manager consultant on large, complex public infrastructure projects including The Banks, Great American Ball Park, Smale Riverfront Park Carousel, Government Square, Metropolitan Sewer District Wet Weather Improvement Program, San Francisco International Airport, Bay Area Rapid Transit and Baltimore Metro.

Mr. Beck holds an M.S. from the University of California at Berkeley and a B.S. in Architecture from the University of Cincinnati. He is a licensed Architect in Ohio and California and is certified as a LEED accredited professional by the U.S. Green Building Council Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design.
