

***Roberts's Abrogation of all of Americans' rights under the  
Constitution and Bill of Rights***

Chief Justice John G. Roberts, Jr. protects his illegal DRE policy of authorizing the states to assert jurisdiction (without an iota of authority) over unassailable American rights, liberties, and freedoms, by abrogating Americans' rights under the Constitution in all 50 states. This leaves Americans without any ability to obtain relief or redress against Roberts or the state judicial corruption that the Roberts's authorizes under DRE.

Roberts's does this by authorizing federal and state judges to violate the American people's Article III of the US Constitution that established Americans' right to access to US judicial power; First Amendment's prohibition of laws infringing on the exercise of religious beliefs and that protects freedom of speech and the right to petition the Government for a redress of grievances; the Due Process Clause of the Fifth Amendment, the right to a speedy trial is as fundamental as any of the rights secured by the Sixth Amendment and the Ninth and Tenth Amendment limitations the federal government's powers to those granted in the US Constitution and reserves all other power to the States (under the protection afforded to freedom and liberty by the Constitution and its Bill of Rights) and the people, and the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment.

Amendment I. Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; or abridging the freedom of speech, or of the press; or the right of the people peaceably to assemble, and to petition the Government for a redress of grievances.

Amendment V. No person shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime, unless on a presentment or indictment of a Grand Jury, except in cases arising in the land or naval forces, or in the Militia, when in actual service in time of War or public danger; nor shall any person be subject for the same offence to be twice put in jeopardy of life or limb; nor shall be compelled in any criminal case to be a witness against himself, nor be deprived of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor shall private property be taken for public use, without just compensation.

Amendment IX. The enumeration in the Constitution, of certain rights, shall not be construed to deny or disparage others retained by the people.

Amendment X. The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people.

Amendment XIV. Section 1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States; nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

Amendment XIV. Section 5. The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article.
