More charges in serial robberies case

An additional 26 charges connected to a series of commercial thefts in Sherbrooke will be filed against suspects Francis Veilleux and Michaël Sanders, while a third defendant, Francis Deslauriers, will see the 22 new charges filed against him.

The three, aged 20 to 23, allegedly committed robberies at the Sherbrooke

Exhibition Center, 24-Juin Training Center, the André-Nadeau centre de plein-air, the Thibault-GM Complex, the Mont Bellevue Chalet and the Shogun Sushi and Stratos Pizzeria restaurants on 12th Ave. Primarily, they ribbed ATMs and cash boxes.

The three will face charges of break and enter with the intention of committing theft, wearing a disguise, possession of burglary tools, and possession of prohibited and restricted weapons.

The three will be formally charged today at the Sherbrooke Courthouse during a bail hearing.

For the time being, the three individuals are accused of stealing less than \$5,000, possession of stolen goods, breaking and entering, wearing a disguise, and possessing various burglary tools that can be used to get into a vehicle, a vault or a safe, including either a crowbar, a grinder, a sledge hammer, a clamp, and radio transmitters.
