Summer Saturdays bring with them for many the morning visit to a local public market or two. Often nestled in the heart of various small township towns; a public market brings fresh produce to costumers and the opportunity to support local food producers. With Covid-19 still a concern, markets are doing all they can to open safely in respect and caution to assure the well-being of those who stop by. The Bolton-Est Market will open up on June 13th.

Building on the success of its 9 weeks of online public market, with a hundred or so customers served by car each week, the Apiary announces the opening of the East Bolton public market under the big top, starting Saturday 13 June, from 9:30am to 12pm. The Market will be open every Saturday morning until October 10 and will take place at Terrio Park, 18 Terrio Street in East Bolton.

East Bolton has purchased a brand new 40 X 60 feet tent to host the market this summer.

The Market under the tent will be set up to allow the 2-metre distance currently recommended and to ensure a smooth and comfortable flow of traffic

for visitors.

The Marketplace will be maintained to accommodate citizens who prefer this avenue and will be open year-round. Some products will be available only on this platform and citizens will be able to easily combine the two approaches.

In 2019, more than 90 K\$ of local food was sold at the East Bolton Market. At the rate things are going, we expect to at least double these results in 2020.

Like all things Markets like this one require the support of residents, tourists and visitors to assure its success. Having access to fresh local produce as well as a variety of local products based on the food producers in any given area is certainly to the benefit of any community. Organisers of this particular

market have found ingenious ways to support a variety of initiatives in the area.

If you should find yourself wondering how best to spend your Saturday morning a drive around the townships to sample what these public markets have to offer might help you to discover something new as well as instilling a habit in making a stop at your local public market apart of your weekend traditions. Your family will certainly thank you for it as they get to sample the treats you bring home each week.
