



WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

The lack of unlimited water is where the term “dry camping” comes from. In our 26- and 28-foot trailers, you will have a full freshwater tank when you arrive at your campsite, and we are happy to come replenish your supply with our water truck for a small fee. But due to the fact that we may be working at a camp farther away when you call, we may not always be able to get to you immediately. So it’s a good idea to learn how to conserve and manage your fresh water supply by following these tips.



- Using water sparingly will slow down the rate at which your gray (used) water tank fills up. This means fewer times you have to fill up the “blue boy” portable tank and dump it out.

If you find your graywater tank is filling up too quickly, there are ways to keep from having to dump it so often:

- Use a plastic dishpan in your shower, to capture any water that would otherwise go down the drain. Use this water for washing the dishes (it’s still clean!), flushing the toilet, etc.
- Help our local flora and be extra safe during this long drought! Rinse water and dishwasher that you collect in a dishpan can be dumped on plants or at the base of trees. You can also use such collected water to douse your campfire and flush the toilet.
- Showering is one of the quickest ways to use up your freshwater and fill up your gray tank. A great water-saving alternative is a solar shower. There are some great collapsible 5- or 6-gallon solar showers available for under \$25.00 that will provide enough water for several showers.
- Use paper towels to wipe grease and food particles from dishes before washing. You’ll need to use far less soap and water; fewer food particles will get into the gray tank to make it smell; and the towels, when dry, make great campfire starters.
- We provide a refillable water jug that you can empty into your freshwater tank. We recommend using it once a day to fill your tank back up.
