PROGRAM

The program is designed for optimal achievement in Mandarin and English languages, where students can achieve sophisticated language development through direct instruction, engaging classroom activities, and songs, in a caring environment with active student involvement and participation.

Classroom instruction is evenly divided between two high quality, classroom teachers following the 50/50 English/Mandarin model. The English-speaking teacher uses half of the instruction day to teach English language arts curriculum. The Chinese-speaking teacher uses the other half of the day to teach Chinese language arts, including reading, speaking, writing and listening, while integrating elements of Chinese literature and culture. Both teachers teach core subjects such as math, social studies, science, and other topics from the California Core Curriculum.

Students will conduct hands-on activities in fundamental science and engineering, along with reading, writing, and literature. You will be amazed at how quickly your child becomes a comfortable and competent Mandarin speaker!

Mandarin schools have plenty of benefits for students and parents. "In the last 20 years or so, there's been a virtual explosion of research on bilingualism," says Judith Kroll, a professor at the University of California. Research has found the benefits include enhanced:

- 1. Attention
- 2. Empathy
- 3. Reading comprehension
- 4. School performance and engagement
- 5. Diversity and integration

Other benefits to language learning and bilingualism, some of which are unique to Mandarin schools, include:

- Math skills: Studies indicate that learning Mandarin can help children acquire early math skills. In particular, students learn both basic number concepts and calculation skills (e.g., addition, subtraction, etc.). At Balboa School, students can accelerate their math skills as they learn using Singapore Math®.
- Learning music: Mandarin is a tonal language that can naturally can help with music abilities. Exposing them to musical tones as young children, can help them learn and develop music skills faster than others. In fact, studies show that learning a tonal language helps kids to better perceive pitch.

- Cognitive development: Studying Mandarin opens pathways in the brain which can help improve a wide range of intellectual and academic skills, such as logical reasoning, reading comprehension, and focus. Studying Mandarin stimulates different parts of the brain because it is very different than English in sound, tone, and script. A recent UK study indicated that Mandarin learners use both parts of the brain, unlike English, which focuses on the temporal lobe.
- Cultural literacy: Learning a new language exposes students to new cultures. As we become a more global society, students can use their cultural literacy to teach tolerance and help others recognize the importance of treating other cultures equally and fairly.

Student Dress Code

In order to promote a successful learning environment, students at Balboa School must comply with the following personal appearance standards:

Hair	 Must be clean, combed and neatly trimmed or arranged. Shaggy, unkempt hair is not permissible regardless of length.
Shorts and skirts	Must be no shorter than mid-thigh when seated.
Hats, hoods, and sunglasses	Must not be worn indoors.
Pants and jeans	 Pants and jeans must be clean and in good repair. Bagging/sagging clothes are not permissible.
Shoes and sandals	Shoes and sandals should be appropriate for the workplace.
General	Clothing is to be neat, clean, in good repair and appropriate to a typical workplace.

Attendance Policy

ABSENCES

Balboa School encourages consistent, on-time school attendance. Please try to schedule appointments and trips during non-school time.

- Parents or guardians must call the school and notify the Administrative Office by 8:15 a.m. if their child is going to be absent from school on a given day. A student may be excused from school when the absence is due to:
 - Personal illness or injury.
 - Medical, dental, optometric, or chiropractic services rendered.
 - Attendance at funeral services for a member of the immediate family.
 - Exclusion for failure to present evidence of immunization.
 - Exclusion from school because student is the carrier of a contagious disease.
 - Pre-approved sporting competition.
- Any student who is absent in excess of 5 consecutive days for the above reasons will need to provide a medical/legal note.

Arrivals & Pick-up

ARRIVALS / PICK-UP

- Parents may drop off their child at school between 8:15 a.m. 8:25 a.m. and must picked up by 3:15 p.m. and 2:00 p.m. on early dismissal days, unless your child is enrolled in an afterschool program.
- Students who arrive after 8:30 a.m. must check in at the Administrative Office to receive a pass.
- Parents must call and notify the Administrative Office in advance when a student needs to leave school early. Parents must sign the Early Pick-up Log located in the Administrative Office area before picking up their child.
- Scooters, bicycles and skateboards must be locked up.

School Rules & Policies

ENROLLMENT/DIS-ENROLLMENT

- Enrollment contracts are required to be signed and submitted annually for each student before the start of the school year.
- Written thirty-day notice is require upon departure of the school program before the end of the enrollment contract.
- Enrollment contract will be terminated upon dis-enrollment
- Deposits received will be forfeited.
- No refunds

ELECTRONICS

MEDICATION POLICY

- Students are not allowed to keep any medication in their possession while they are on school property.
- **All medications**, including prescription medication and over the counter medications, must be turned in to the counselor.
- The student's parents and prescribing physician **must** complete and sign a medication form in order for the medication to be dispensed to the student. School Counselor will be responsible for administering the medication.

SCHOOL PROPERTY

- Students and parents will be expected to cover the charges for any damaged property.
