

## **Minutes February 26, 2019**

The City of Langdon Place held its regular monthly meeting at the John Knox Presbyterian Church. Mayor Frank called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present at the meeting: Mayor Mike Frank, Commissioners Charlie O'Bryan, Scott Scinta, Aaron Hardy, Kenny Bauer, and Attorney Stan Chauvin III

Guest attending the meeting: Phil Means

Absent from the meeting: City Clerk/Treasurer Theresa O'Bryan.

The minutes from the January meeting were read. Council member Hardy made a motion to accept the minutes as read. Council member Bauer seconded the motion. It passed in favor of accepting the minutes 4/0.

### ***Old Business:***

A replacement tree was planted on Kennersley Drive. A replacement tree was authorized for planting at 9012 Duxbury when the winter weather breaks.

Effective March 6<sup>th</sup>, both weekly trash pickup and bi-weekly recycle pickup will be on Wednesdays.

Nick Holmes has issued a package of drawings and paperwork related to the new entrance walls on Westport Road to Council member Charlie O'Bryan to retain in the City of Langdon Place files.

David Tapp will refurbish and paint mailboxes on Valhala Court and Kosmar Court as soon as winter weather breaks. This will complete the first cycle of repairs for the entire City. A mailbox at 2700 Kennersley Drive needs repair.

### ***New Business:***

Council member Bauer has sent an inquiry to apply as a Block Watch Captain to the District 8 police office. No reply has been received yet.

Fall leaf pickup days were changed to Monday November 11 and Monday December 2 to avoid Thanksgiving weekend when many residents will be out of town traveling, and not available to rake leaves for pickup.

Mayor Mike Frank is investigating costs for repaving several City streets.

A sidewalk on Kennersley Drive which was leveled during the repair grinding last year has broken and is presenting a possible tripping hazard. Council member O'Bryan will incorporate the repair of that sidewalk into the scope of concrete curb and ADA sidewalk repairs planned in the spring/summer.

Louisville Metro is proposing to increase its insurance premium tax to 12.5% in 2019 then to 13.5% in 2021 and 15% thereafter. This increase will be effective throughout Jefferson County including all of the suburban cities. Louisville Metro's increase over the rate now charged by each city will be captured by Louisville Metro unless the suburban cities match the Louisville Metro rates. Representatives from

Langdon Place City Council will attend a meeting sponsored by the Jefferson County League of Cities on March 2 to discuss plans and guidance for new ordinances which would match Louisville Metro rates and thereby allow the tax increase to be retained in the City of Langdon Place.

A Neighborhood Informational Meeting will be held on March 11 at 7PM at John Knox Presbyterian Church to review the re-zoning application from R4 to R5B for addresses at 2813 and 2316 Weissinger Road. This application was filed on February 25, 2019.

**Finance Report:** The monthly bill report was presented to the council for review. Council member Scinta made a motion to approve the bills and Council member Bauer seconded it. It passed 4/0 in favor.

The next meeting will be March 26, 2019 at 7:00 p.m.

There was no further business; Mayor Frank adjourned the meeting at 8:08p.m.
