

First and Ongoing Open Call for Papers

Deadline for Volume 1, Issue 1 is July 1, 2020.

Review for Religious: A New Series is a Catholic scholarly journal founded to promote the study of Catholic religious life and its relationship to God, the Church, and the world. Emphasizing discussions on the nature of religious life and its practice in the contemporary world, the journal features refereed articles, invited essays, and reviews of books, old and new, related to religious life. It is published three times annually and welcomes contributions from a wide variety of fields, disciplines, and perspectives.

The first edition of *Review for Religious* will be published in Fall 2020. Two volumes annually will be open; one will be themed. Our deadline for the inaugural edition is July 1, 2020.

Review for Religious is a peer-reviewed journal that solicits articles and welcomes unsolicited articles in accord with the journal's mission. Book reviews are generally commissioned by the editorial staff; those wishing to submit a book review should be in touch with the managing editor prior to writing.

Submissions:

Review for Religious publishes articles normally between 2,000 and 6,000 words, inclusive of footnotes. Please remove any reference to your identity in unsolicited articles. Your submission will undergo double-blind peer review. The editorial staff will indicate the editorial decision of acceptance (with or without expected revisions) or rejection normally within four months of receipt.

Possible topics include, but are not limited to: theology of religious life, socio-economic studies of consecrated life, historical studies of consecrated life or personages, third-order or lay religious life, philosophical questions related to religious life, and articles or reflections on other areas of religious life, which could include canon law, liturgy, social services, pastoral practices, etc.

Submissions for general consideration may be made at any time during the year. Submissions for special topics will have deadlines attached. Please contact the editorial office after four months if you have not heard the status of your submission.

Review for Religious also will consider unsolicited shorter features (1800–2100 words) worthy of publication, including carefully argued responses to articles in *Review for Religious* and conversational-style essays on religious life.
