Dear Hampton Families,

The health and wellness of our staff and students continues to be the first priority of the Hampton Public School. To that end, this letter is to inform you that the Hampton Public School, after consultation with the Hunterdon County Health Department and with all Hunterdon County School Districts, has decided to close for students beginning on Monday, March 16, 2020. Public health officials advise that social distancing is an effective strategy to prevent the spread of COVID-19. The district will be implementing virtual home instruction during the closing of the school building. The chart below illustrates the timeline in which we will be implementing a virtual home instruction format:

Tuesday, March 17, 2020	Online Home Instruction begins
Wednesday, March 25, 2020	Online Home Instruction continues Reevaluation of the current situation with the Department of Health.
Monday, March 30, 2020	Possible reopening of schools for all staff and students Pending the reevaluation of the situation.

Please note, that upon reevaluation of the situation on March 25th, the district may remain closed through the end of spring break (April 17th). Our goal is to maintain instructional continuity using virtual means. To this end, your child's teacher(s) has developed home instruction lessons and activities that will be posted or sent home by Monday, March 16th.

During this period of virtual learning, email is the preferred communication method for parent-teacher communications. Teachers will be available for "virtual office hours" on weekdays according to a specific schedule that will be sent by the end of the day on Monday if students or parents have questions.

Contemplating weeks without a regular school routine can be overwhelming. Please know that we are doing our very best to make decisions that are in the best interest of our entire school community. Updates will be posted to the district website and will be sent via our Realtime program as new and relevant information becomes available. We thank you for your patience and understanding as we continue to work through this difficult situation.
