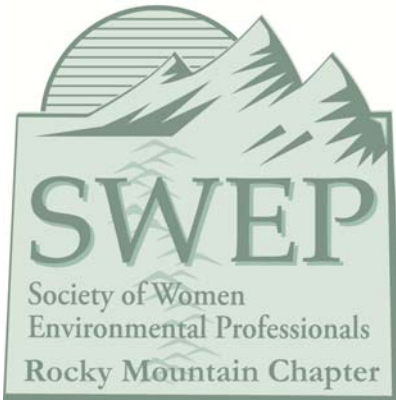

It’s a story of a childhood and adolescence in the shadow of the Cold War, in a landscape once startlingly beautiful and tainted with invisible yet deadly particles of plutonium. It’s also a story about the power of secrets—both family and government.
