On Tisha b'Av, thousands of men - and women - gather around the Western Wall, sitting on low stools and reciting Lamentations and Kinot.

This Thursday July 30 is - **TISHA b'AV** - the saddest days of the entire Jewish calendar, a day when we lament the destruction of Solomon's Temple by the Neo-Babylonian Empire and the Second Temple by the Roman Empire in Jerusalem, as well as other tragedies that befell the Jewish People over the millenia. It is a day of full fasting - as on Yom Kippur - and a day when the Book of Lamentations followed by the recitation of Kinnot, liturgical dirges that lament the loss of the Temples and Jerusalem are read. We are trying to put together a schedule for the day, including the previous evening:

Wednesday Jul 29 - 8th of Av - The fast starts at 8:25 PM.

Evening prayers - if we have a Minyan - will start at around 8:15 or 8:25 PM

Morning prayers on July 30th - Tisha b'Av being a Thursday, will start normally at 7 AM, with appropriate Tisha b'Av prayers.

Evening Prayers on July 30th - Tisha b'Av include full Tallis & Tefillin and a Mincha Torah reading at 7:45 PM, if we have a Minyan. The fast ends at 9:06 PM

No calls will be made by either shul. We are asking each member who wants to attend these important services to inform Mike Andradi, myself or the Rabbi so that we can determine if we have a Minyan, and the appropriate arrangements will then be made. Please try to let us know of your intent by Tuesday evening July 28

PARSHAT HASHAVUA - WEEKLY TORAH PORTION

Deuteronomy Deuteronomy 3:23-7:11




Moses tells the people of Israel how he implored G-d to allow him to enter the Land of Israel, but G-d refused, instructing him instead to ascend a mountain and see the Promised Land.

Continuing his "review of the Torah," Moses describes the Exodus from Egypt and the Giving of the Torah, declaring them unprecedented events in human history. "Has there ever occurred this great thing, or has the likes of it ever been heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of G-d speaking out of the midst of the fire . . . and live? . . . You were shown, to know, that the L-rd is G-d . . . there is none else beside Him."

Moses predicts that in future generations the people will turn away from G-d, worship idols, and be exiled from their land and scattered amongst the nations; but from there they will seek G-d, and return to obey His commandments.

Our Parshah also includes a repetition of the Ten Commandments, and the verses of the Shema, which declare the fundamentals of the Jewish faith: the unity of G-d ("Hear O Israel: the L-rd our G-d, the L-rd is one"); the mitzvot to love G-d, to study His Torah, and to bind "these words" as tefillin on our arms and heads, and inscribe them in the mezuzot affixed on the doorposts of our homes.
