ISRAELI NOTE: Approximately 2 weeks ago, while excavating a road in the Galilee near Kibbutz Hanaton, an Israeli Arab archaeologist made a startling discovery. He discovered a Mikveh from 2000 years ago, predating the destruction of the 2nd Temple. Determining the age was relatively easy, as the plaster used to cover the Mikveh walls was the same as was used during the Temple period. Later plasters were of a different composition and different colour. Almost as amazing was the fact this Israeli Arab archaeologist, wanted to preserve this Jewish Mikeveh and decided to excavate it whole - after receiving permission from the Israel Antiquities Authority - and moving it next to the new Jewish Mikveh of the Kibbutz. This is what Israelis call living in harmony, and anti-Semites call apartheid.

PARSHAT HASHAVUA - WEEKLY TORAH PORTION

First Days of Sukkot Torah Readings

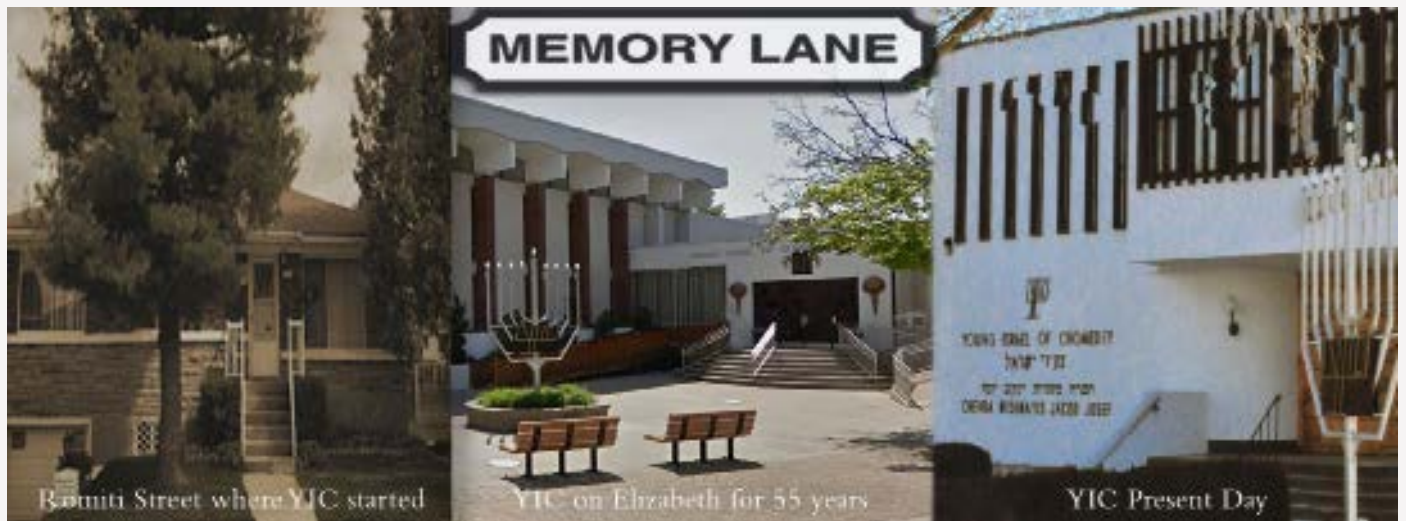
Leviticus 22:26-23:44 Numbers 29:12-16



The reading begins with an injunction that a newborn calf, lamb, or kid must be left with its mother for seven days; one may not slaughter an animal and its offspring on the same day.

The reading then lists the annual Callings of Holiness — the festivals of the Jewish calendar: the weekly Shabbat; the bringing of the Passover offering on 14 Nissan; the seven-day Passover festival beginning on 15 Nissan; the bringing of the Omer offering from the first barley harvest on the 2nd day of Passover, and the commencement, on that day, of the 49-day Counting of the Omer, culminating in the festival of Shavuot on the 50th day; a “remembrance of shofar blowing” on 1 Tishrei; a solemn fast day on 10 Tishrei; the Sukkot festival — during which we are to dwell in huts for seven days and take the “Four Kinds” — beginning on 15 Tishrei; and the immediately following holiday of the “8th day” of Sukkot (Shemini Atzeret).

G-d declares the fifteenth day (and the subsequent 6 days) of the seventh month to be a holy convocation, no work shall be done during that time. The reading then describes the Sukkot offerings which were brought in the Holy Temple.

“Tentative thoughts”

There is more to the High Holiday season than meets the eye. Encompassing the “Ten Days of Rependance” are Rosh Hashanna, the “Day of Judgment”, and Yom Kippur on the 10th of Tishrei. What this all means is that those days between Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur are quite significant. The individual’s rating and expectations/predictions for the upcoming year are weighed in and a report is printed out and placed in an envelope that is still not sealed. It remains open to positive change, suggestions, and modifications for the next 8 days. Only after Yom Kippur does the glue on the flap get licked and stuck in place. The People continue praying, making resolutions, engaging in charitable ventures, trying to improve themselves so as to insure a good grade and fate are sealed in that envelope. Historically Yom Kippur, “the Day of Forgiveness” is the day that Moses obtained forgiveness for the Israelites’ sin of the Golden Calf.

At the start of Yom Kippur services when you walk into Shul take a look at your Machzor and notice that there are hundreds of pages to get through in the next 25 hours. Take the time for self examination of your individual relationship to G-d in the world and what are your true feelings towards G-d ?

At the end of Yom Kippur we hope and pray that as a community we will have the continued strength to serve our members as we have done in the past and we will try even harder to ensure that we will have a successful future where we can again get to meet often and share happy occasions and simchas in good health and peace.
