The San Antonio City Council races are officially non-partisan, that is, candidates are not allowed to officially run on political party tickets (such as Democrat, Republican, Libertarian, etc.) for this election.

With that said, many candidates, as individuals, have-with exceptions-voted in political primary elections of a political party that normally, usually, generally reflects their viewpoints on life.

For instance, a May 2021 city council candidate who has voted in last year's March 2020 Republican Party primary election probably has ideals that reflect the Republican Party platform, i. e. conservative, pro-life, pro-traditional family, pro-tax cut, pro-school choice, etc. stands (ref.: Google Texasgop.org/platform)

Similarly, a city council candidate who last year voted in the 2020 Democrat Party primary election probably has ideals that are of a leftward nature: pro-abortion, pro-homosexual, anti-tax cut, anti-school choice, etc. (ref.: Google the "Texas Democratic Party Platform").

Incidentally, any voter in the respective political party's primary election/caucus (you, me, anyone) automatically becomes known as an officially registered member of that party for the following two years.
