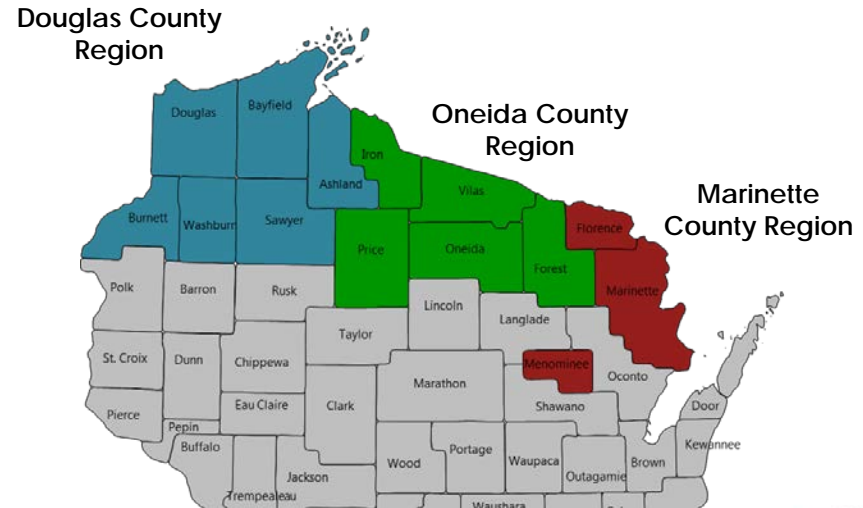

4. Prioritize women, especially pregnant women, and intravenous drug users

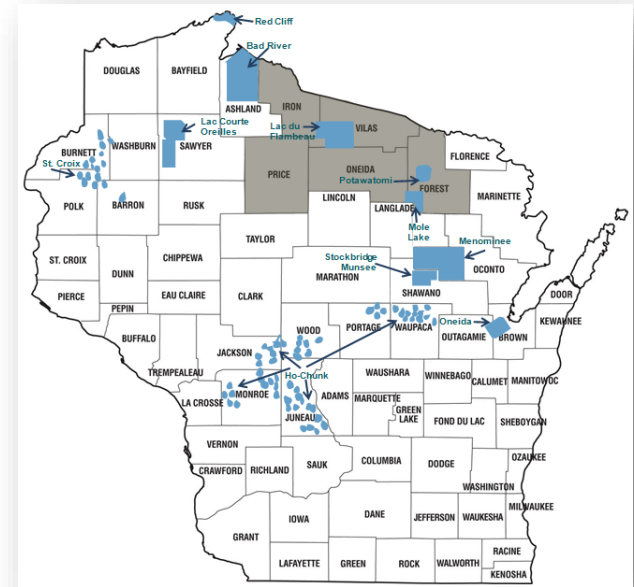

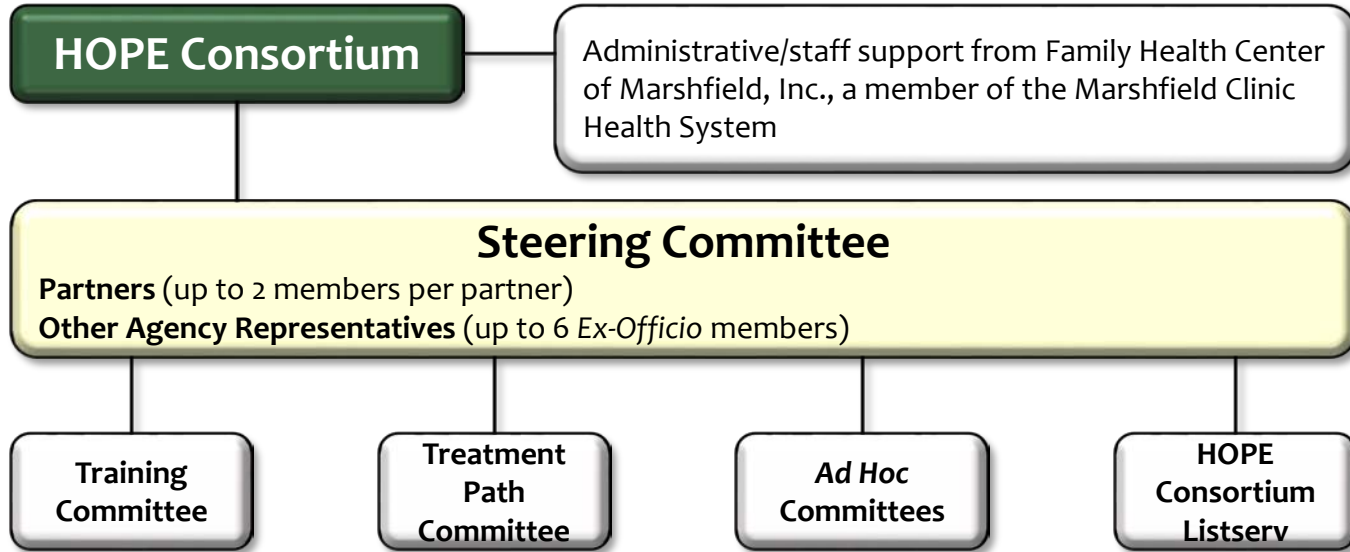
Build hope in communities together to overcome substance use disorders and support recovery.

Grant-Funded Services

HOPE Consortium Participants are eligible for:

- Care coordination services at no cost
- Priority treatment access at partner agencies
- Access to grant funds as payer of last resort for medication and/or urine drug testing

HOPE Consortium partner agencies have access to:

- Local and regional training and technical assistance
- Curated evidence-based patient, family, and provider resources
- A web-based health information exchange platform



Client Benefits

- Grant dollars may be used as “payer of last resort” – when all other funding options are exhausted, grant dollars may be used to cover costs necessary for the care of patients with an opioid and/or methamphetamine use disorder, including:
 - Quantitative urinalysis
 - Medications (buprenorphine products, naltrexone, and naloxone)
 - Care coordination
- **All pathways to recovery, whether abstinence-based, cultural, or medication-assisted, are respected.**

- Curated evidence-based patient, family, and provider resources, general and tailored to specific needs

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Health Information Exchange

- REDCap-based data collection tool
 - Web-based and secure
- Data collected intended to:
 - Fulfill reporting requirements
 - Demonstrate impact of efforts
 - Allow rapid communication between partner agencies with shared clients
 - Support future evaluation
- Not an electronic health record.

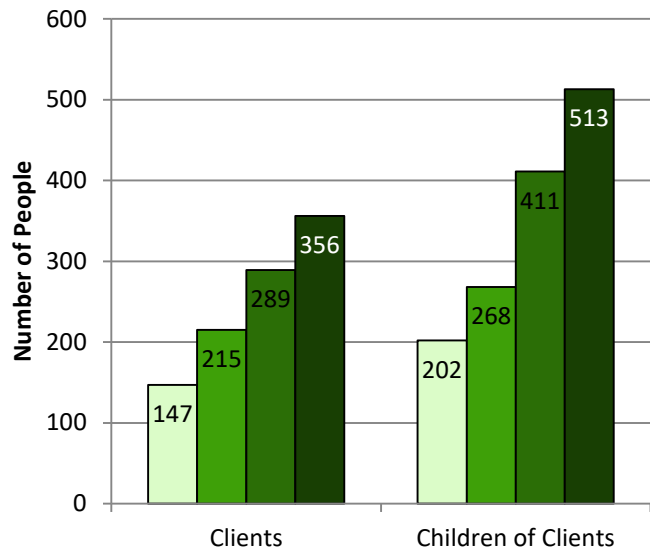

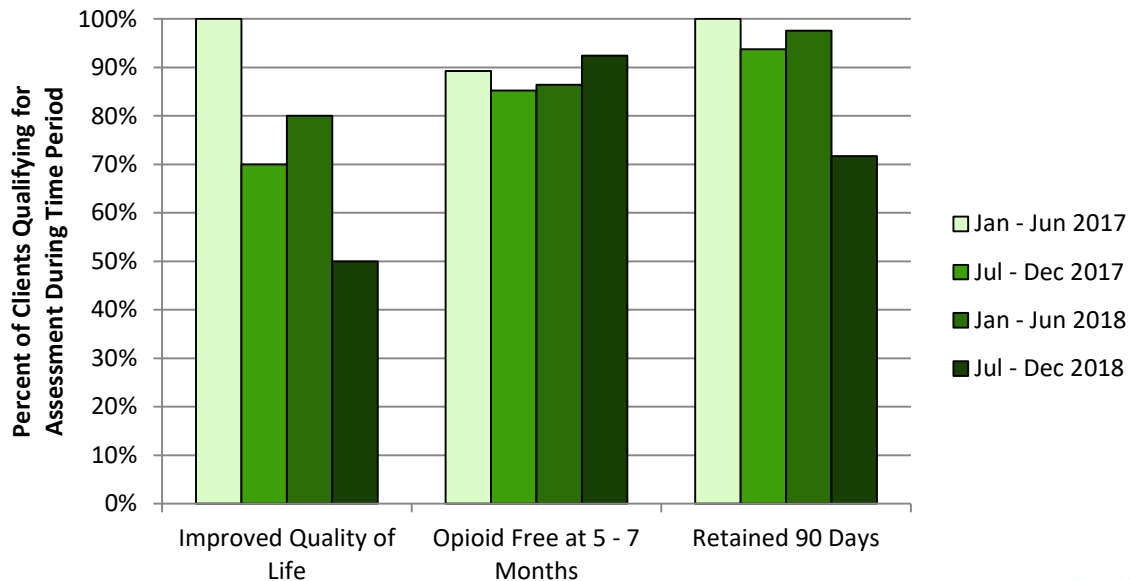
