From the President

Happy summer! Such a beautiful time to enjoy Mount Hood.

My name is Alene Davis, and I have recently stepped into the role of president of the board of the Mt. Hood Cultural Center and Museum.

My earliest recollections of Mt. Hood were learning to ski on the rope tow, then the T-bar at Summit. I loved the freedom and speed of skiing, and there is just something magical about snow in the forest.

As a child, we had family friends with a USFS cabin in Rhododendron, and I loved to stay with them in the forest. It was always a dream of mine to have my own cabin in the woods. That dream became a reality in 2012 when my husband Norm and I bought a little 1930s Forest Service cabin off Road 12 in Rhody.

I first got involved with the museum board in 2013 at the suggestion and sponsorship of Bing Sheldon, the museum’s long-time president. Bing and I were architects, and he was both a mentor and friend of mine. In 2017, the board elected me vice president and then president in 2019.

I have experience being on a number of other boards, most recently serving as president of the American Institute of Architects. I’m hoping that my board experience and my background as an architect will serve the museum well as we launch our Capital Campaign for the Museum Expansion.

My focus for MHCCM for the next two years includes both raising awareness of the museum in the state and the region, as well as crafting a viable strategy for our Capital Campaign. This expansion will nearly double our space in Government Camp, providing needed space for community gatherings, expanding exhibit and archive space, and increasing our mountain gift and book gallery.
