“Humanity continues to face two simultaneous
existential dangers—nuclear war and climate
change—that are compounded by a threat
multiplier, cyber-enabled information warfare,
that undercuts society’s ability to respond.

Political conflicts regarding nuclear programs
in Iran and North Korea remain unresolved
and are, if anything, worsening. US-Russia
cooperation on arms control and disarmament
is all but nonexistent.”

The US abandoned the Iran Nuclear Deal,
withdrew from the Intermediate-range Nuclear
Forces Treaty (INF) and abandoned the
Antiballistic Missile Treaty (ABM).

The threats to North Korea continue. The
world’s nuclear nations, led by the USA,
proceed with expensive nuclear modernization.

WE DEMAND:

**US: join United Nations Ban on Nuclear Weapons and negotiate with
nuclear weapons states to dismantle nuclear weapons.**

**US: join the world to meet climate threats and sign Paris Climate
Change Agreement.**

US: Sign a Peace Treaty with North and South Korea.

**End the Administration’s economic and political war campaigns against
Iran, Venezuela, Cuba and Syria. Remove sanctions.**

US: Cut the Military Budget, Fund Human Needs!
