Signs that a Catholic is tainted with Liberalism by Fr. Ercoli Carlos

Many Catholics today are tainted with Liberalism without even knowing it. To learn the signs, the information below was compiled from the book, "Liberalism Is a Sin" (praised by the Sacred Congregation 1887, English translation imprimatur 1899)

Liberalism is the belief that one creed is as good as another, under the false plea of liberty of conscience. It is based on the unrestricted exercise of the individual's reason upon the subject matter of Revelation. The individual or sect interprets as it pleases, rejecting or accepting what it chooses. The origins of Liberalism stem from Protestantism, which rejected the principle of authority in religion. Liberalism leads to the belief that no creed is just as good as any. Religious beliefs or unbelief become mere matters of opinion. Liberalism severs the bond which binds men to God and seeks to build a human society on the foundations of man's absolute independence. Liberalism is basically rationalism; the doctrine of the absolute sovereignty of human reason.

In short, Liberalism is the dogmatic affirmation of the absolute independence of the individual and of social reason. Catholicity is the dogma of the absolute subjection of the individual and of the social order to the revealed law of God. One doctrine is the exact antithesis of the other, so Liberalism and Catholicism are impossible to reconcile in any way.
