Ebony Tucker is the Advocacy Director for the National Alliance to End Sexual Violence (NAESV), working on federal sexual assault policy initiatives. The National Alliance to End Sexual Violence educates the policy community about federal laws, legislation and appropriations impacting the fight to end sexual violence.

Prior to joining NAESV, Ebony served as the Executive Director of the Louisiana Foundation Against Sexual Assault (LaFASA), helping to develop anti-sexual assault initiatives with the goal of providing better services and resources for survivors in Louisiana. Before coming to LaFASA, Ebony was the Associate Executive Director and Legal Assistance for Victims (LAV) Project Director at the Florida Council Against Sexual Violence. In these positions, she worked with legislators, sexual assault centers and victims of sexual violence on legislation, policy and criminal justice response as well as representing survivors in civil legal proceedings.

Ebony has also worked as a civil rights attorney for the Florida Commission on Human Relations. She received her JD from the Florida State University College of Law in 2005.
