Passionate About the Asbury Café

The Asbury Café has been a fixture at the NM State Fair since 1960. All proceeds are donated to local charities.

I have been involved with the café for about 35 years. I started volunteering when I was in college and only missed volunteering in 1996, when my daughter was born 2 days before the Fair. I love the café—I love the workers, the customers, the craziness, the pies, and, most of all, I love what we are able to do together. Every year we donate 10s of 1000s of dollars to local charities that feed people who are hungry.



The café is successful because of all of the people from Asbury and nearly 10 other churches who help every year. It is a lot of work, but when everyone helps, it is not too much work for any one person.

This year's Fair is September 5-15. In August sign-up sheets will be put out for worker slots. Before then, however, there are some immediate needs for people to coordinate various activities.

Asbury Pie Party Coordinator: Schedule and organize pie parties for Asbury's share of the over 1900 pies needed this year.

Delivery Coordinator: Schedule and coordinate the delivery of pies to the fairgrounds each day by experienced delivery volunteers.

Asbury Schedule Coordinator: Put out sign-up sheets, enter names into the online system, and schedule substitutes for worker slots.

The Asbury Café is important to our community, and it takes many people to make it successful. Please prayerfully consider donating time to this Asbury mission and tradition.

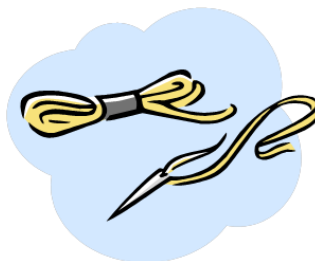


CALLING ALL CRAFTERS

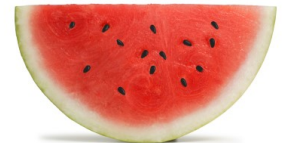
