CHAPTER TWO—I BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST

THE ONLY SON OF GOD

82. Why is Jesus called "Christ?"

"Christ" in Greek, "Messiah" in Hebrew, means the "anointed one." Jesus is the Christ because he is consecrated by God and anointed by the Holy Spirit for his redeeming mission. He is the Messiah awaited by Israel, sent into the world by the Father. Jesus accepted the title of Messiah, but he made the meaning of the term clear: "come down from heaven" (John 3:13), crucified and then risen, he is the Suffering Servant who gives "his life as a ransom for many" (Matthew 20:28). From the name Christ comes our name of Christian.

FACES OF THE POOR—2019 The St. Vincent de Paul Conference here in Montgomery operates out of Holy Spirit, however we do have members and/or people that support us, here at St. Peter's Church. Where does our money and time go?

This is the last in our series of Faces of the Poor, how and what St. Vincent de Paul spends the money provided by people like you.

A family of 5, Dad working for \$9.00 an hour, cash, Mom working for a local dry cleaner and three children 15 to 5 years old. We have helped this family with food for several months. At each home delivery we would discuss with the father about working for cash and how that would hurt his family if he lost his job. Plus, although he is only in his early 30's. he is not building up Social Security or paying taxes. We would encourage him to look for another job. He did not finish High School and does not have a GED, so he feels very insecure about looking for a job. However; he is very responsible, and a nice young man and he has technical abilities, for example he can repair cars and small appliances. We kept at him about looking for another job. He found one! He passed the drug test and is now working for a large company, making a good salary with health insurance for himself, paid vacations and other benefits that one gets with a salary. Oops, a small problem. Right before he was to start work, his radiator went out and he was to start working on the third shift, it is very hard to find someone to drive him to work and pick him up at those hours. His wife does not drive. He called us and we were able to buy him a radiator for a little over \$200.00 and he was able to put it in himself. He did not miss a day of work, a very happy ending. But if SVDP was not there to help, his brand-new job would have been lost. We were very pleased to be able to help him but could not do it without the support from this church and Holy Spirit and both our parishioners.
