

## 10 Commandments of Marriage - Part 6

**Ex. 20: 7** Lord will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain.

### **I. Do not take the Lord's name in vain**

A. When you cut covenant with someone, you would take their \_\_\_\_\_ as a part of your name, and they would take your name as a part of theirs.
