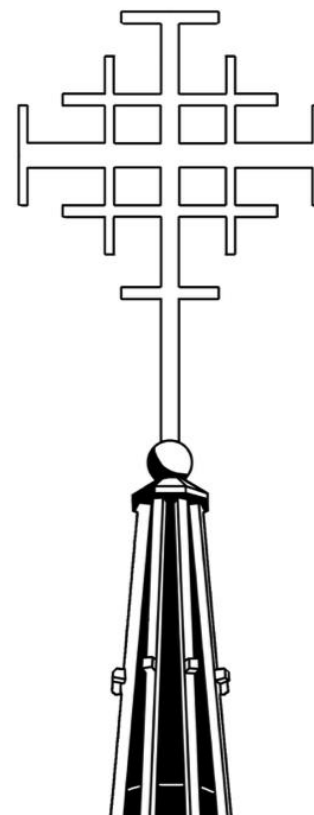

Are We Open to God's Surprises?

Newness always makes us a bit fearful, because we feel more secure if we have everything under control, if we are the ones who build, program and plan our lives in accordance with our own ideas, our own comfort, our own preferences. This is also the case when it comes to God. Often we follow him, we accept him, but only up to a point. It is hard to abandon ourselves to him with complete trust, allowing the Holy Spirit to be the soul and guide of our lives in every decision. We fear that God may force us to strike out on new paths and leave behind our all-too-narrow, closed and selfish horizons in order to become open to his own. Yet throughout the history of salvation, whenever God reveals Himself, he brings newness-God always brings newness-and demands our complete trust. Are we open to "God's surprises"? Or are we closed and fearful before the newness of the Holy Spirit? Do we have the courage to strike out along the new paths which God's newness sets before us, or do we resist, barricaded in transient structures which have lost their capacity for openness to what is new? We would have to ask ourselves these questions all through the day.
