Last Week Speaker



Ita Neymotin was our speaker Wednesday. She leads the Office of Criminal Conflict and Civil Regional Counsel for the 20th Judicial Circuit.

The Office of Criminal Conflict steps in to represent people who can't afford their own lawyer but whose case could be a conflict for the public defender's office.

Lawyers from the publicly funded agency also work on dependency cases, helping to reunite parents and children. She oversees 140 lawyers throughout 14 offices in 14 counties.

Ita saw the worst of humanity when she was a child. She and her family fled the Soviet Union after her grandfather's execution. "We became the enemy of the people," They settled in the United States as political refugees when she was 6.

"I am lucky enough to live in this country. Unfortunately, not all countries have such a great judicial system. Some justice systems, like the one I came from in the former Soviet Union, are seen to be based purely on luck."

There were difficult times when the family landed here. The Cold War was on and Russian immigrants were not well received. Despite the hardships her father never lost sight of the importance of freedom in America and never gave up on the pursuit of freedom for his parents.

"My parents and I escaped from a life of Soviet oppression, from a society devoid of human rights. Because of this, the passion I have to represent those who can't afford representation in their Constitutional Freedom was born."

Ita warned, "Our justice system is a gift, not an entitlement. We must work to protect it. For only it can truly protect all of us."

She said, "I think it is unfortunate that people don't realize how lucky we are to have freedom of speech. But that being said, I think there also has to be respect...freedom of speech is different from being hateful. I think these two boundaries need to be better established."

Ben Nelson Inducted

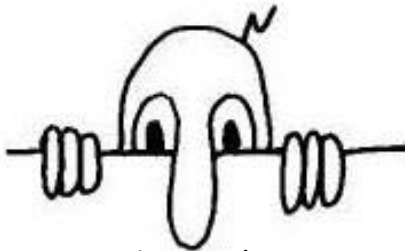
