

A Village Board Regular Meeting was held on Tuesday, May 16, 2017 at 7:00 P.M. at Village Hall, 9 Fairlawn Drive, Washingtonville, New York.

PRESENT:

Mayor Joseph Bucco, Deputy Mayor Paul Lang, Trustees Thomas DeVinko and Diane Mack.

ABSENT:

Richard Calore.

ALSO PRESENT:

Village Clerk Christine Shenkman.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG:

Mayor Joseph Bucco led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

MAYOR'S ANNOUNCEMENTS:

Mayor Joseph Bucco stated "I would like for everyone to keep the Town of Montgomery Police Chief in their thoughts and prayers as he was shot today responding to a call for service. I would also like to thank the Village of Washingtonville Police Department for responding to the incident to assist. Additionally, Village Police Officer Keith Lipsey was injured this past week after responding to assist with a fire call in the Village of Washingtonville. Hopefully, Officer Lipsey will be returning to work soon."

"With that being said I would like to thank the Village of Washingtonville Police along with all Police Officers for their service day in and day out especially as we conclude Police Week to honor those Police Officers who were killed in the line of duty."

Mayor Bucco expressed thanks to the Knights of Columbus – (K. of C.) for hosting a fundraiser for Linda Wells on Saturday.

The Mayor explained the Parade route for the 2017 Memorial Day Parade will remain the same as it has been in the past. The Parade will begin at Washingtonville Senior High School and march down East Main Street (Route 94) to Arrowpoint Lane. It will turn left onto Arrowpoint Lane and go to Ahern Boulevard, where it will turn right onto Ahern and march down to Firemen's Memorial Park located at Washington Boulevard.

RESOLUTION – PAYMENT OF VILLAGE WARRANTS:

Deputy Mayor Lang made a motion, seconded by Trustee DeVinko and adopted to authorize the payment of Village Warrant Numbers 6, 7 and 8; Trustee DeVinko requested all warrants be provided to Village Board by the Village Treasurer on the Friday before each meeting, instead of the day of said meeting.

RESOLUTION – REPAIR OF SLIDES – VILLAGE PARKS:

Trustee DeVinko made a motion, seconded by Deputy Mayor Lang and adopted to authorize the transfer of \$4,871 from Village T Fund Account to A714042 – Parks and Recreation to cover repairs on three (3) childrens slides in the Village Parks; said Resolution passed by a unanimous vote of the Village Board.

RESOLUTION – REPAIR OF BATHROOMS – L. VERNON ALLEN PARK:

Discussion regarding the repair of bathrooms at L. Vernon Allen Park was tabled until the June Village Board Work Session meeting, and Department of Public Works (D.P.W.) Superintendent Christopher Martino provides the Village Board with a list of repair work and costs.

RESOLUTION – RECYCLING DUMPSTER – WOODFIELD SKATEBOARD PARK:

Trustee DeVinko made a motion, seconded by Mayor Bucco and adopted to authorize a refuse and recyclable dumpster to be placed at Woodfield Skateboard Park between April 1 and November 1 at a cost of \$99.00 per month from Budget Expenditure Account Code A816042 – Refuse Dumpsters-Service; said Resolution passed by a unanimous vote of the Village Board.

Mayor Bucco stated the Village Board needs to review the situation regarding dumpster screening in the Village. The Mayor explained there are Codes and Laws in effect, and they need to be enforced.

RESOLUTION – INSTALLATION OF PERMANENT ELECTRIC AT L. VERNON ALLEN PARK:

Discussion regarding installation of permanent electric at L. Vernon Allen Park was tabled.

RESOLUTION – APPROVAL OF PUBLIC ASSEMBLY PERMIT – SUMMER CONCERT SERIES:

Approval of a Public Assembly Permit for the Summer Concert Series was tabled until Village Police Chief Stephen J. Bogert reviews said permit.

UPDATE – VILLAGE BEAUTIFICATION COMMITTEE:

Trustee Mack reported prices have been obtained for nine (9) flower planters at a cost of \$33.00 per container. An additional cost of \$20.00 is for potting soil dependent upon how much soil is needed for each planter. The Village Beautification Committee would like them in place on May 22 or May 23. Debbie Lester of Flowers by JoAnn will be choosing the flowers.

NO DUMPING SIGNAGE:

Trustee Mack stated along Village property and other areas, dumping of leaves and other material has occurred on a routine basis, including the side of L. Vernon Allen Park, area across from 17 Decker Drive, Ahern Boulevard by dog disposal unit, and the side of Ballard Pond Road in the open field. Trustee Mack suggested signage should be placed in these locations to discourage said dumping. Village Attorney William Frank indicated permission to install signage needs to be obtained from all

Homeowners Associations involved, and Mayor Bucco will contact the appropriate groups.

RESOLUTION – SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING – “AMEND VILLAGE CODE ENTITLED ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES”:

Mayor Bucco made a motion, seconded by Trustee DeVinko and adopted to schedule a Public Hearing regarding “Amend Village Code Entitled Alcoholic Beverages” to be held on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 at 7:00 P.M.; said Resolution passed by a unanimous vote of the Village Board.

RESOLUTION – SCHEDULE PUBLIC HEARING – “AMEND VILLAGE CODE ENTITLED PEDDLING, SOLICITING AND TRANSIENT MERCHANTS”:

Trustee DeVinko made a motion, seconded by Mayor Bucco and adopted to schedule a Public Hearing regarding “Amend Village Code Entitled Peddling, Soliciting and Transient Merchants” to be held on Tuesday, June 20, 2017 at 7:15 P.M.; said Resolution passed by a unanimous vote of the Village Board.
