

Beginning Weaving on a Rigid Heddle Loom: *Making a Scarf*

Are you ready for a new crafting skill but don't know about investing the money in equipment? Perhaps you have a little experience and are ready to move beyond washcloths and potholders. Weaving looms can come in many shapes and sizes, but this beginner's class is more about 'driving the car' than studying the mechanics of it. By the end of this class, you will create a bit of wearable art by manipulating pretty yarn and gently tamping it down.

2-4 pm: finish weaving, removal from loom, finishing ends, steam press

All materials and equipment supplied. No experience or supplies are required.

Price includes yarn as well as use of a rigid heddle loom and equipment (warping peg, clamps, threading hook, bobbins, etc.). Students keep the 5-6' scarf they create.
