## President's Report



As I write my final President's Report, I reflect back on all the things our chapter has accomplished this past year. In addition to our traditional events for Memorial Day, July 4, and Veteran's Day, we also hosted the VASSAR Semi Annual meeting in Newport News. Also, for the first time in some years, we commemorated Constitution Day at historic Pohick Church. We received coverage in four local papers for that. We dedicated plaques listing the patriots buried at Pohick Church and the patriots who served from Fairfax County as part of the county's 275<sup>th</sup> anniversary. The Fairfax County 275<sup>th</sup> Anniversary event and history fair allowed us to educate the public on the SAR mission. We hosted our President General for two events: the Memorial Day parade and the wreath laying at Arlington National Cemetery. I was honored to have been asked to talk about the SAR at a meeting of the Thomas Nelson DAR Chapter in October. This chapter was gracious enough to make a donation on our behalf to the DAR Friends of Americana Collection, which supports the DAR's manuscript and imprint collection. Regrettably, we have had to postpone the grave marking for four patriots interred in the Presbyterian Cemetery that I had hoped to conduct in conjunction with our Annual Wreaths Across America (WAA) participation at the Alexandria National Cemetery. Regarding Wreaths Across America, I want to commend Paul Briggs (past chapter president), Floyd Ryan, Jamie Callender, and Jack Coulter for leading this year's WAA drive. Because of their efforts, and your contributions, we have raised enough funds to buy 140 wreaths (\$2,100) to be placed on veterans' graves at the Alexandria National Cemetery on December 16. This effort to obtain this corporate-level sponsorship goes back to 2012 when Past President Bob Carr and Floyd Ryan first involved our chapter in this event. What a fitting time to commemorate our nation's heroes as well. Hopefully, the weather will cooperate this year. Details on that are in this newsletter.

We have areas for further outreach to the community, particularly school age children. So, as a reminder (I talked about this in the previous newsletter), I want to appeal to those of you who may have school age children or have some contact with a teacher to get the word out about the various SAR Youth Contests. The theme of the Americanism Poster contest for the 2017-18 school year is Revolutionary War Events. Entries from grades 3-5 are eligible to participate in this contest. Revolutionary War curriculum is taught in Grade 4 in Virginia between December and February. The theme of the Americanism Brochure contest for the 2017-18 school year is Foundational Documents of the United States to include the U.S. Constitution, U.S. Bill of Rights, Declaration of Independence, Articles of Confederation and the Federalist Papers. Entries from grades 6-8 are eligible to participate in this contest. This curriculum is taught in Grade 6 in Virginia between February and March.

None of this would have been possible without your volunteerism and support, and I was proud to have presented a few of you with medals for your support of the SAR this year.

Keep up the good work. Although no longer chapter president, I hope to continue to serve our chapter and the SAR in the years to come.

## Welcome Newest Member: Virgil "Pete" Farley

Pete Farley was inducted at our November meeting. Pete was born 74 years ago in Charleston, West Virginia and raised in nearby Marmet. His father was killed in a coal mining accident when Peter was barely 5 years old. His mother went to work and her mother moved in and helped raise Pete and his brother. He graduated Charleston High in 1961. Interest kindled by high school printing courses led to an apprenticeship program through The International Typographical Union, becoming a skilled Journeyman Printer. After employment in various printing shops and newspapers in WV and VA he joined the print department at The Wall Street Journal in Silver Spring in 1973, just as the days of hot metal typography were coming to an end with the arrival of the computer era. Eventually he started his own business as a consultant of Graphics and Printing and spent the last fifteen years of his career at the Defense Logistics Agency at Fort Belvoir, VA.

Pete has long maintained an avid interest in both History and Ancestry. He also has revolutionary ancestors on his mother's side, including Sgt. Robert Chambers who was with Washington in Valley Forge and a POW for 14 months on a British ship. He is active in supporting the following organizations: Friends of Mt. Vernon; The Mosby Heritage Area Association; Civil War Trust; Theodore Roosevelt Association; National Baseball Hall of Fame; Society of American Baseball Research; and now the George Washington Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution.



Pete is retired and married to his wonderful wife Carol with four children and seven grandchildren.

Pete's eligibility for the SAR is based on his descent from Thomas Farley Jr., a private in multiple VA units 1776-1781. He was present at the battles of Shallow Ford in Oct. 1780, and Alamance River, and Reedy Fork in March 1781, all in North Carolina. His father Thomas Farley Sr. was also active, participating in the battle of Point Pleasant in West VA in 1774, fought under Gen'l McIntosh in 1778 and was an Indian scout in 1779.



# Has Your Patriot Ancestor's Grave Been Recognized and Marked?




There is perhaps no more fundamental or sacred activity for the SAR than the registration and marking of Revolutionary patriot graves – a ceremony that serves to cherish, honor and preserve the memory of those that fought valiantly in order that their descendants could be endowed with those inalienable right that we now enjoy.

Accordingly the George Washington Chapter Graves Registration and Marking Committee has made it a priority objective to honor with formal grave markings as many as possible GW Chapter member patriot ancestors. The first step is the identification, documentation and registration of the Patriot grave. Many thanks to Compatriot Jamie Callender for his remarkable effort in reconciling disparate and in many cases ambiguous Patriot ancestor data bases resulting in a comprehensive list of patriot ancestors and the status of any grave marking (see [http:// www.gwsar.org/ancestors.html](http://www.gwsar.org/ancestors.html)).

With less than ten percent of ancestor Patriot graves marked, there is both a challenge and incredible opportunity. If you would like your ancestor's grave marked the Committee will assist you in navigating and completing the established SAR process, specifically with the creation of a biography which brings to life the Patriot's key relevant accomplishments and with conducting the grave marking ceremony procedure itself which includes the placement of a brass marker as a visible symbol to the public that the person buried at that place aided in the cause of the American Revolution.
