Hurricane Matthew

Haiti, October 11, 2016: This communication comes with a great sense of urgency and desperation. The aftermath and recovery from Hurricane Matthew is proving to be just as devastating as the actual act itself. The Caribbean American Civic Movement has staff members on the ground working along with local officials, fire fighters and local pastors to assist with our efforts in the most impacted areas of Haiti. There are tremendous efforts and sacrifices being made but the need is even greater. WE NEED YOUR HELP! We are thankful for an Engineer arriving on site today to survey the area where the roads were washed away so that a plan can be drafted to build a pathway to reach potential survivors. This is necessary in order for us to get resources to these areas as well as to enable us to get people out to safety. CACM is leading efforts to see this plan of action to fruition, but we need your help to do so. Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$25,000 to get equipment, food, water and medical supplies to help the victims until International help is able to reach them.
