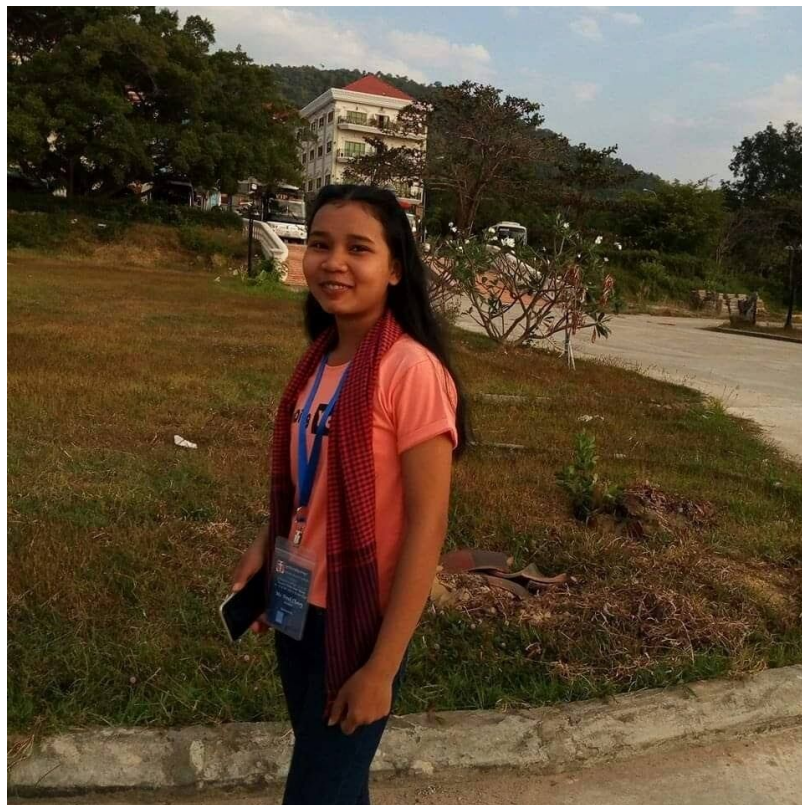

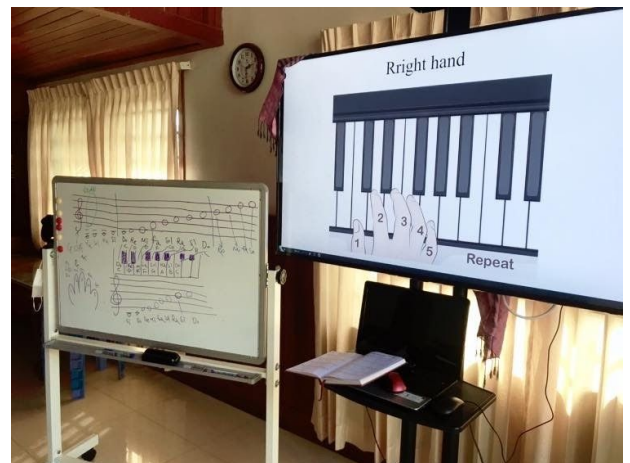
Music Class for SWH students!
