



## An Update from us on our COVID-19 protocols

Dear Chagrin Valley Farms Lesson Program Clients -

As we head into the winter season, I would like to take this opportunity to reiterate the protocols that **must** be followed by all Chagrin Valley Farms lesson program participants as it relates to minimizing the spread of COVID-19.

The following items are mandated by the management of CVF for barn visitors including trainers, staff, clients, parents and guests:

- A minimum of six feet between people must be maintained at all times, including outdoors
- **Face coverings must be worn at all times except when a client / trainer is on a horse or unless a staff member is working independently and can maintain six feet of social distance**
- Anyone who is ill must stay home
- Anyone with a temperature of greater than 100.4 is not permitted on site
- Any client who appears to be symptomatic will be asked to leave
- Family members / drivers / friends / caregivers are encouraged to remain in their cars. When entering the building and / or being on site to observe lessons or assist their riders, masks must be worn in all common areas including the aisles, the club room and the rest rooms and six feet of social distance must be maintained at all times
- The time spent at the facility is to be limited to the time required to care for the animal before and after your scheduled lesson time. There are to be no gatherings of any kind in or around the facility unless previously approved by CVF management
- Notification must be given to the CVF management team if any lesson participant or client is known to test positive for COVID-19 or is known to be exposed to a person who tests positive
- Clients should perform their own symptom assessments and log their own temperatures prior to entering CVF

Please help us to be able to continue to keep our facility open to lesson clients by wearing masks, adhering to social distancing protocols, performing personal health checks before entering the facility, staying home if you feel sick, washing your hands regularly while at the barn, using hand sanitizer often and helping to clean / disinfect public areas.
