 - All Late arrivals must notify Boyd Brady 334-321-8826 no later than 5:00 p.m. [CALL ONLY for approval and to receive a late arrival verification number]
 - Otherwise at 7:00 pm on October 13, 2020 your entry(s) will be scratched from contest, entry fees are non-refundable.
 - Any late arrivals must be approved before OCT. 9, 2020 and arrive BEFORE 7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 13, 2020.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 14, 2020

- 8:00 a.m. Novus Showmanship (This is a non-sanctioned event and open to the public. You do not have to have an animal registered in the show to participate in this showmanship event. Registration will take place onsite for this event. Ribbons will be awarded. No entry fees, no cash rewards. Age divisions and classes will be determined at time of event. This showmanship event is not part of the Sanctioned show and open to non-exhibitors. Out of state Youth Showmanship will be determined at check-in on 10/13/2020.
- 8:30 a.m. Showmanship (age Division determined by age on day of show) for Alabama Youth show ONLY.
**Per Livestock Executive Committee, you must pre-register for Showmanship and not day of show.

Showmanship Classes

Beginners Class: 4 – 8 years of age
Junior Class: 9 – 12 years of age

Intermediate Class: 13 – 15 years of age
Senior Class: 16 – 19 years of age

DAIRY SHOW RULES COMMITTEE:

The Dairy Show Rules Committee will be composed of Boyd Brady, Brooke Zeleny, Brady Ragland, Anita Ramsey, and Guy Hall. **(All ruling and findings of this committee are FINAL)**

1. Exhibitors will make all entries online at www.alnationalfair.org under the participate link. There are instructions on how to enter your livestock under this link.

A. Before 9/18/2020 Entry Fee \$10 per goat

B. NO LATE ENTRIES

C. AFTER 9/18/2020 THERE WILL BE

- i. No late entries
- ii. No refunds
- iii. Indifferent Classes

2. Goats must be shown in owner's name, as it appears on ADGA registration papers. All entries are subject to verification.

- Must be a registered agent with ADGA no less than 30 days prior to show. All entries are subject to be verified with ADGA.
- **Any exhibitor or owner involved in fraudulent entry will automatically forfeit ALL premium money won by himself or farm and will be barred from future participation in this show.**

3. Pens are available as follows:

A. Goat pens are 4' x 6'. Once pens are set, they are set. No moving the pens at all. **NO EXCEPTIONS!** If you are caught moving pens, you will forfeit your premiums!

B. Pens will be issued at *REGISTRATION* by *ADMINISTRATION*.

4. Upon receipt of entry, each livestock exhibitor will receive a complimentary 10-day wristband. All other family members will be required to purchase gate pass for admittance to the Fair (prices vary daily). Passes will be sold at the Livestock Gate Entrance. (Children 5 and under are admitted FREE with paid adult.)
5. **ALL GOATS** must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued within 30 days of the show date by an accreditable veterinarian certifying the animals to be free of visible signs of contagious and or infectious diseases.
6. Be sure to check that the tattoos are **legible** and match the certificate, as issued by ADGA. If you recently re-tattooed your goat, registration papers must state "retattooed". If your goats are microchipped, you are responsible for providing a microchip reader. **NO HORNED ANIMALS ALLOWED.**
7. Animals are to remain on your trailer until you are cleared through check in and have received your pen assignments.

NO CLEAN-UP

8. Non show does may be transported to the show (if approved by show committee prior to Oct. 1, 2020), but must be housed in a separate location. Non show does must be included on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
9. Overnight sleeping will be allowed in barn (See #10). Tents are not allowed in the barn. Other sleeping items may not be set up prior to 9:00 p.m. Tuesday. Aisles must remain open at all times. All sleeping items must be neatly stored away no later than 7:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 14, 2020. The barn will be closed to visitors at 10:00 p.m. daily.
10. ***EXHIBITORS sleeping in the barn must have a permit to sleep in the barn.*** You MUST notify Stephanie Pittman at stephanie@alnationalfair.org prior to October 1, 2020 for a permit.
11. **POSITIVELY, NO OPEN FIRES, CHARCOLE FIRES, GRILLS, COOKING OR FOOD PREPARATION WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE BARN, PENS, DISPLAYS, OR SHOW AREAS.**
12. ***Exhibitors*** must furnish their own watering containers. Community or common watering facilities are prohibited.
13. **DISPOSAL OF MILK.** All milk is to be disposed of only in areas designated by the Show Committee. Violators are at risk of forfeiting their entry fee and premium money.
14. No shaving goats inside barn or buildings with show arenas.
15. **DRESS CODE.** The show committee realizes the focus is on your goat, but we would like you to help us put on a first class image to the fair management, public, and media.

MUST WEAR:

- A. Clean white shirt, can have farm logo, narrow trim
 - B. Dark blue or black long pants, blue jeans, white pants
 - C. Close toed shoes
16. Exhibitors as well as volunteers are expected to abide by the ***INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS***

1. Under 2 years of age
2. At least 2 years to under 3 years
3. At least 3 years to under 5 years
4. At least 5 years of age and older
5. SENIOR GRAND CHAMPION DOE
6. RESERVE SENIOR GRAND CHAMPION DOE
7. Senior Best in Show competition will be held at the end of all the breed shows

- **Junior Division** – The Junior Division consist of does under 24 months of age that are NOT in milk and have never freshened.

8. Junior Kids: Under 6 months
9. Senior Kids: 6 months & under 12 months
10. Junior Yearlings: 12 months and under 18 months
11. Senior Yearlings: 18 months and under 24 months

13. RESERVE JUNIOR GRANDCHAMPION DOE
14. Junior Best in Show competition will be held at the end of all the breed shows
