1. Enclosed please find a detailed explanation and appeal of the unfavorable information detailed in paragraph 4 of the MSSR from 19 March 2019 in regard to SPC [redacted]. She has no pending personnel actions and requests that her appeal be processed with the highest priority.
2. The explanation and appeal explains her position that the adverse MSSR as per National Security Adjudicative Guidelines, Guideline B is incorrect.

4. Based on the evidence provided, SPC [redacted] requests that the MSSR be withdrawn and that she be allowed to continue in the MAVNI program.

Re: Explanation of the unfavorable information detailed in paragraph 4 of the Notification of Adverse Military Service Suitability Recommendation (MSSR) from 19 March 2019.

I would like to explain and update the unfavorable information that led to the adverse MSSR as per National Security Adjudicative Guidelines, Guideline B.

The Notification of the Adverse MSSR states that: Specifically, your mother and step-father are employed by the [redacted] government. Although now deceased, your father was a [redacted] Officer and your grandfather was a [redacted] Specialist Officer in the former [redacted] military.

I would like to address each person mentioned above individually to explain and update the information that led to the adverse MSSR. All information was voluntarily provided by me during my CI interview. I was open and provided as much information as I could to completely answer the questions posed to me during the interview process. My MOS is 68W and does not require any security clearance.

[redacted] has a socialized medical system thus making everyone working in any medical facility a government employee even though they have no direct contact or dealings with the [redacted] government structure.

My mother is employed by a hospital where her job duties include and are limited to cleaning and disinfecting the facilities and medical equipment.

My step-father, who is now deceased as of last year, was a doctor in a small village hospital.

My biological father was not part of my life since I was 6 years old. I know very little of his service in the military. The interviewer helped me to identify his possible title based on the little information I have and openly provided during the interview.

My grandfather retired from the military when my mother was in middle school. His title was also identified by the interviewer based on my limited knowledge of the duties he had. He never shared much about his time in service with me personally.

While both did serve in the [redacted] military, this was a requirement of the country that all serve in the military. [redacted] broke away from the oppression of the [redacted] when

I was 8 years old. The US and [redacted] are allies and have a good relationship. The US has condemned [redacted]

Information about both of them was gathered by me from my mother while preparing the documentation that was required for the CI interview. I wanted to do my best to provide accurate and honest information to the best of my abilities.

At this point in my life no one in my family, living or deceased, has influence on my current decisions aside from the values of doing my best to do the right thing at all times as they taught me.

Furthermore, I would like to request a copy of the full, unredacted investigation into my background.

This correspondence is not intended to be a final position statement and I hereby reserve all my rights.

SPC [redacted] enlisted into the United States Army Reserves (USAR), assigned to the [redacted] I Company [redacted] (ice) on [redacted] 2015. At the time I was serving as Headquarters Platoon Leader. I have served as the Executive Officer and now serve as the Company Commander. I have noticed that SPC [redacted] has been dedicated to all duties assigned to her, going above and beyond to complete every task. She has attended every Battle Assembly since being in-processed into the unit by her Recruiter on February 9, 2016. She has and continues to maintain the standards of the army height/weight.

SPC [redacted] has kept every medical/dental appointment through the Reserve Health Readiness Program (RHRP) that she has been asked her to make in order to keep her medical readiness in a green status. Regular Troop Program Unit (TPU) Soldiers are paid to attend those appointments, but SPC [redacted] is unable to receive pay. In spite of the restrictions that she is currently facing, SPC [redacted] continues to live and act on the Army Values.
