



1. Minutes 11/14/2019
 - a. Lori Lawnsdale moved and it was seconded by Amber Marince to approve the minutes; motion carried unanimously by all members.
2. Treasurer Report (Alicia Cutting)
 - a. This year the Harvest Moon Supper (HMS) brought in \$5,184, the expenses were \$1,842 and the total profit was \$3,341.
 - b. The Holiday Shop sold \$2,359.64 worth of items and only had a few expenses.
 - i. Will look to have the total profit for the January meeting.
 - c. Cookies with Santa came in under the \$200 budget (free event).
 - d. The PTO account has a balance of \$20,628.
 - e. A \$350 attorney fee for bylaws will be reflected in January's report.
 - f. Laura Filiau moved and it was seconded by Nicole Sloane to approve the Treasurer's report; motion carried unanimously by all members.
3. Susan Johonnett spoke about a First Congregational Church UCC new initiative called Creation Justice
 - a. It's a big idea of saving the world and she asked the PTO if we'd be interested in taking a survey to help them understand the lay of the land for another demographic group.
 - i. Will be distributed sometime in January or February.
 - b. They have some ideas around recycle/reduce/reuse, being kind and caring to animals and those around us, as well as other big items.
 - c. They're looking to connect with roots and other outside programs.
 - d. Will bring the survey to next PTO meeting.
4. School Board Report/Principals Report (Alicia)
 - a. In the most recent School Board meeting they conducted a policy review and are getting to point to approve.
 - i. They are also going to start working on the budget in January and there was nothing on the warrant articles other than the operating budget.
 - ii. January 8th, 2020 will be the next meeting.
 - b. Principals Report
 - i. Blizzard bags are coming home next Tuesday (12/17) and it was suggested to get them done when there's downtime.
 - i. This is a trial run, so please reach out and let people know if you do or don't like it.
 - ii. Everyone should've received a notification around the winter activities, previously it was New England College running it but now the school is doing on their own.
 - i. For ice skating students will need a helmet, it was suggested to bring one for sledding as well (bike helmet is sufficient).
 - iii. Bus transportation is provided and there's an option to select whether to rotate through the activities or not.
 - i. It was suggested to choose yes for everything, so students can have an option to do a variety things.

 - i. Ran smoothly, need to discuss at the end whether we will run it again. A lot of items arrived broken.
 - ii. For next year we're looking to have four volunteers per shift and discussed having specific days/times for each class and a second register.
 - iii. Another suggestion was to have a family night or a time during parent pickup where parents can come in and shop with their kids.
 - iv. Little shoppers is a similar company that could be an option for next year.

 - i. Kids had a great time, feedback was that there was too much glitter.
 - ii. Only had a couple of volunteers, reached out to 5th/6th and high school with no response, so activities were changed to parent led.
 - iii. Without volunteers, we may not continue with this event.
 - iv. Discussed continuing with the event but just having pictures with Santa.
 - v. Rec department had more activities this year, so we may look at highlighting that event instead.
