HOW TO SAFELY RIDE A MOTORCYCLE AT NIGHT! Night riding is one of the most enjoyable experiences you will encounter on your motorcycle. However, night riding can also be an extremely dangerous activity as it is difficult for some motorists to see you and respond by avoiding you. Safety comes through increased road presence. You can greatly increase your road presence and help avoid an accident with another motor vehicle. The most common causes of accidents and death for motorcyclists is a motorist turning left and into the pathway of the biker. Other types of common accidents are at intersections and rear end collisions. I have listed a few techniques which will improve your day and night presence to help other motorists see you. 1. Wear BRIGHT clothing, especially at night, reflective or fluorescent highlights on your jacket, maybe a stripe on your helmet, anything to make you stand out on another vehicles headlights before they are too close and upon you. Consider a reflective vest to wear over your jacket; when the sun goes down, put on the vest for your night ride home. 2. Motorcycle lighting: Good lighting is a crucial factor in your safety. Examine your lighting at night - are your tail lights and headlights bright enough that someone will see you, do you need brighter bulbs, LED tail lamps, extra bright headlamps, etc. The better you can be seen, the safer you are, and the better you can see, the less chance you have of overdriving your headlamp. 3. Check your headlamp aiming angle. 4. Ride with your high beam on always during the daytime. 5. Add dual running headlights to your motorcycle, especially if you are a frequent night rider. 6. Consider your driving technique. Are you speeding so fast you will not be able to stop in time? Stay in the center of the lane when practical. This is where you are best seen. Riding on the edge of the road causes you to blend in with the street lighting. However, always give yourself plenty of room when passing other vehicles traveling in the next lane in case they decide to change lanes while you are passing. This will give you more time to react. And never stay in their blind spot. We have many opportunities as the season warms up to be out all day and return home at night, in the dark. Please keep these points in mind. Accidents are preventable, and we wish each of you a safe and fun summer of riding.

That's really an awesome accomplishment when you think about it. Over one million dollars in just 13 years!

There is plenty of work to be done before we're ready. Please stop out to Kutter's and sign up in the white book to help out the weekend of June 15th and 16th. We need bartenders, help with ticket sales (50/50, bike raffle, beer), help with registration, help with the bike games and the bike show, poker run help, help with parking, help with set-up at the park Friday morning, and help with clean up on Sunday at Kutter's and at the park. The Tub Run was the fourth largest fund-raiser in the country for MDA in the Harley family! This is the third year in a row that the Tub Run has been in the top four in the nation!! We will be raffling the bike off at the park Saturday night. What are the chances that Greg Huffman will do the unthinkable, and win a bike for the third time in just two years? Be at the Thresherman's Park Saturday evening and see for yourself.

Well people, I need to end this and get back to work. We need your help to make the Tub Run another huge success this year. Please stop out to Kutter's and sign up for the weekend to help out where ever can. You can do more than one thing and you will get the points for all you do that weekend.
