Whether you've been a rider for a week, a month, a year, or a lifetime, you are part of the Harley-Davidson family. As a H.O.G.® member, you know how important the spirit of connection is to our heritage – a heritage built upon the individual stories, passion, and experiences of each rider, dealer, and friend. After all, our stories, passion and experiences form the very connections that make Harley-Davidson what it is.

The Harley-Davidson Museum, set to open in summer 2008 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, has a unique way for everyone to tell their stories and share their experiences through Living the Legend™.

Living the Legend will showcase the spirit of camaraderie that is so important to our heritage. Stainless steel rivets, symbolizing strong bonds, can be customized with your name and a personal statement. The rivets will be displayed for the world to see on either curved steel walls or special plazas on the park-like grounds of the Harley-Davidson Museum.

“We’ve chosen the rivet as a symbol of strength and connection,” said Stacey Schiesl, Director of the Harley-Davidson Museum. “Rivets connect everything from I-beams to blue jeans, and represent the strong bonds forged within our Harley-Davidson family.”

All members of the Harley-Davidson family can create a Living the Legend rivet. Individuals can choose to customize a three-inch or six-inch rivet. The three-inch individual rivets are \$250 and will be displayed on curved steel walls on the Museum grounds. The six-inch rivets – created by dealers, H.O.G. chapters, suppliers, friends, and others – are \$2,500 and will be displayed within the special plazas on the Museum grounds.

The rivets are made from tough, electro-polished stainless steel, and will be displayed outside, taking on whatever nature throws at them. These rivets are built to last another 105 years!

The Living the Legend walls and plazas will display thousands of stories, experiences, and connections among Harley-Davidson motorcycle riders, dealers and friends, and will be a favorite destination of Museum visitors for years to come.

There is no limit to the number of people who can be part of Living the Legend; however, to ensure installation in time for the 105TH Anniversary in August, 2008, enthusiasts should customize their Living the Legend rivets by December 31, 2007.

It is a great time to talk about safe riding in the RAIN! I, for one, can say I have had plenty of rain riding in the last month or so, already. Being conspicuous is as important as developing good wet weather riding skills and using protective gear. Wearing a reflective vest or a good rain suit with reflective stripping is a huge help when visibility gets less. Keep your visibility clear by using an anti-fogging solution to your eyeglasses and face shield. Totes are an inexpensive and effective solution to keeping your feet dry. Since roads are usually slickest in the first hour after the rain begins, brake and throttle inputs need to be predetermined and extremely smooth. Therefore, stay out of the middle of the lane and always watch out for surfaces that get particularly slippery when wet. Use extreme caution, take your time and watch for other traffic with renewed interest. We are more vulnerable and at greater risk of being involved in an accident. Most experienced touring and long distance motorcyclists view riding in the rain as a necessary evil. The fall presents a beautiful day turning to rain, wet leaves on the roads, excessive traffic that has been out to see the fall colors, and your safe ride can be determined by how you prepare to deal with the changes that occur. Good luck, safe riding, and if the rains are too heavy, get off the road and wait it out. Your life and safety is more important than the hour of time you may have lost on your schedule.
