Tsunami Motorcycle Displayed at H-D Museum- A Harley Davidson motorcycle was recovered in May on a isolated beach in British Columbia. The bike had drifted over 4,000 miles across the Pacific Ocean after being washed away in a storage container during the devastating tsunami that struck Japan on March 11, 2011.

In accordance with the wishes of its owner, Ikuo Yokoyama, the remains of this 2004 Harley Davidson Night Train will go on display at the Harley-Davidson Museum in October as a memorial to the tragedy that claimed more than 15,000 lives. Tickets for the museum can be purchased on line.

Led lights for your bike. How visible is your bike at night or on a rainy day to the car and truck driver? The more you draw attention to your motorcycle the better because it breaks that driver's stare we all find ourselves in at one time or another. My wife Loreen has a pearl white Fat Boy low with black accents and is concerned that people will sometimes look right through her. When we went to the Wisconsin state H.O.G. rally this year she found something that really caught her eye, (Pun intended). Over in the corner of the parking lot was a white tent and in front of that tent stood a black board with a design of bright colored led lights. They changed colors and randomly blinked on and off. We walked over to investigate and found a man installing these lights on a motorcycle that looked incredible. She was sold because it meant more bling and she loves bling. We had the LED lights installed around the upper frame of her bike. They primarily show up at night but that is good for safety. They even came with a small remote to change the colors and the flashing speed. The lights are allowed to be on when she is riding but they cannot flash red or blue to fool others into thinking she is an emergency vehicle. The colors are bright but not blinding, and are the primary and secondary colors. If she is out front the headlights from the bike behind her will out shine them but if she is the last bike or riding alone they are very noticeable. I think the purple color shows the best against her white and black bike colors. They have drained her battery because she had shown them off a couple of times and then sat in the garage for a week without starting the bike, but a bike charger takes care of that. As long as the bike is running, the lights will not drain the battery. The colors add safety and style to her already great looking machine.
